# HISTORIC LANDMARK COMMISSION OCTOBER 26, 2015 DEMOLITION AND RELOCATION PERMITS HDP-2015-0886 1408 E. 6<sup>th</sup> STREET

#### PROPOSAL

Relocate a ca. 1895 house to 6407 Porter Street, Austin.

#### ARCHITECTURE

One-story, L-plan, hipped-roof frame residence with recently restored wood siding, and a brick veneer wainscot at the base of the projecting bay; non-historic metal windows in single and double configurations; partial-width shed-roofed independent porch on ornamental metal supports. The house had synthetic siding when first surveyed and researched in 2008, as well as the metal windows and the brick veneer wainscoting.

#### RESEARCH

The house was built around 1895. The first owners and occupants were Dan and Agnes McNamara, who lived here for many years. Dan McNamara was an Irish-born railroad engineer, who lived in this house almost until his death in 1943. Agnes McNamara was born in Texas, and lived here until around 1950 when she moved to a house on Laurel Lane. The house was a rental unit for a period of time after Mrs. McNamara moved out; it was converted to a tri-plex in 1962.


#### STAFF COMMENTS

The house is not listed in any City survey. It was in the area covered by the East Austin Historic Survey (1980), but that survey only identified houses with historical or architectural significance.

#### STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Release the permit upon completion of a City of Austin documentation package, consisting of photographs of all elevations, a dimensioned sketch plan, and a narrative history, for archiving at the Austin History Center. While the house has some interest as the long-time home of a railroad engineer, it has been significantly modified over the years and little of its historic fabric remains. Staff further recommends the erection of a plaque at this site, commemorating the history of this neighborhood as the home of many railroad employees such as Dan McNamara. This neighborhood was intimately tied to the adjacent railroad facilities, and many people who made their livelihood with railroad-related work lived here. With the transformation of E. 6th Street and the Saltillo area, this history may be lost without proper commemoration.

#### **BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES**

### Dan and Annie McNamara (ca. 1895 – ca. 1950)

The 1900 U.S. Census shows Dan and Annie McNamara at 1408 E. 6<sup>th</sup> Street with five children, all under the age of 13. Dan McNamara is listed as an Irish-born locomotive engineer.

The 1910 U.S. Census shows Dan and Annie McNamara at 1408 E. 6<sup>th</sup> Street with three children: Mary, 15, Lillie, 13, and Harry, 9. Dan was 50; Annie was 51. Both had been born in Ireland, but all of the children listed has been born in Texas. Dan McNamara was listed as a locomotive engineer.

The 1920 U.S. Census shows Dan McNamara as a single roomer at 1408 E. 6<sup>th</sup> Street in the home of Travis Hamilton, a high school janitor. Dan McNamara is listed as being 79 years old [should be closer to 59 years old] and a widower, who worked as a locomotive engineer.

The 1930 U.S. Census shows Dan and Agnes McNamara owning the house at 1408 E. 6<sup>th</sup> Street, which was worth \$3,500. Dan was then 73; Agnes was 50. Dan had been born in Ireland; Agnes had been born in Texas. Neither listed an occupation. With them lived two boarders, A.J. and Harry Garner. A.J. Garner was a 46-year old barber who had been born in Texas. Harry Garner was 19 and had no occupation listed.

The 1940 U.S. Census shows Dan and Agnes McNamara as the owners of this house, which was worth \$2,000. Dan McNamara was 83, had been born in the Irish Free State, and had no occupation listed. Agnes J. McNamara was 59, had been born in Texas, and had no occupation listed. They had renters in the house: Ira and Stella Logan, with their daughter, Jessie. Ira Logan was 29, had been born in Texas, and was an assistant foreman for the railroad. Stella Logan was 25, had been born in Texas, and had no occupation listed. Their daughter Jessie was 2. They had lived in rural Bastrop County in 1935.

According to his 1943 death certificate, Dan McNamara was born in Ireland in 1857. He was living at this house at the time of his death. He was retired.



Namara, retired Southern Pacific engineer, 88, died in a local hospital early Tuesday morning. Mr. Mc-Namara was with the Southern Pacific for 50 years. He was born in Ireland, March 9, 1857. He came to this country from Ireland at the age of 16. Surviving him are his widow, Mrs. Agnes J. McNamara et Austin: two daughters, Mrs. A. H. Elward of Lakehurst, N. J. and Miss Mary K. McNamara of Austin; six sons, D. F. McNamara of Memphis, Tenn., C. A. McNamara of Tulsa, Okla., E. W. McNamara of Seminole, Okla., J. C. McNamara of Dallas and H. W. McNamara of Houston. Rosary services will be held at Cook Funreal home Tuesday at 8:30 p. m. Requiem mass will be held from St. Mary's Catholic church at 9 a. m. Wednesday with Father James J. O'Brien officiating. Burial will be in Mt. Calvary.


Obituary of Dan McNamara Austin Statesman, July 27, 1943
