To Interested Parties:

Elizabeth Purcell and other interested citizens attended our meeting on Wednesday, October 14th 2015 to voice their concerns about the future of the property at 414 Waller (Pine Street Station). It appears that there is some confusion as to whether the property is eligible for historic zoning and/or other historic designations. The Travis County Historical Commission would like to see a clarification of the historic status of the site and the improvements as well as the future plans for the property.

Our interest in this area extends to the entire project since the proposed Saltillo Plaza Development occupies the historic footprint of the Masontown freedmen's colony of the late 1800's. We feel it important that all due diligence be performed to identify and document any and all historic properties in the area of potential effect of the development, and recognition of those sites felt to be significant.



The above referenced project, which will receive funding from the Federal Transit Administration, would relocate the commuter-rail tracks between Onion Street and the B.35 neighborhood. Existing tracks would allow development of pedestrian-friendly, dense, mixed-use development surrounding commuter rail stations on the Metro Rail Red Line. The proposed double tracks would sit on S. 4th Street between Interstate Highway 35 on the west and Waller Street on the east, and then turn northeast to connect with the current track alignment immediately west of the Plaza Saltillo MetroRail station. No new right-of-way would be required for this project.

Capital Metro's historical consultant, AnsaTerra Environmental, Inc., conducted a reconnaissance survey of the project Area of Potential Effects to identify historic properties. Survey efforts identified a total of 20 historic-age properties, of which one is recommended eligible for listing in the National Register of Historic Places. No eligible historic districts were identified. Capital Metro requests your concurrence with a finding of no adverse effect on historic properties under Section 106.

This letter serves as official comment from Texas State Historic Preservation Officer, the Executive Director of the Texas Historical Commission (THC).

THC staff led by Linda Henderson reviewed the materials. THC has determined that the project will have no effect on historic properties. It is possible that limited cultural materials may be present in the project area. If such materials are encountered during construction or disturbance activities, work should cease in the immediate area, work can continue in the project area where no cultural materials are present. Please contact the Texas Historical Commission's Archeology Division (512/463-6096) to consult on further action that may be necessary to protect the cultural remains.


Dear Historic Landmark Commission Members:

Recently, a series of articles have appeared in the Austin Chronicle regarding the Pine Street Station property, located at 5th and Waller. The articles contain several inaccuracies that we are seeking to clarify now.

Ms. Reji Thomas was delinquent in rent owed to Capital Metro since last spring and notice was sent to her in July that she was in default on her lease with the Authority. No effort or agreement was made to remedy the default on the lease and in September, Capital Metro proceeded with legal action to evict her from the property. During a subsequent eviction hearing, Ms. Thomas did not contest Capital Metro's assertion that she was in default under the terms of her lease. At that time, the judge awarded possession of the building to Capital Metro and gave Ms. Thomas five days to vacate the property in compliance with the law. Capital Metro has been working with Ms. Thomas for several weeks to make arrangements to vacate the property. Capital Metro has granted Ms. Thomas two time extensions to remove her belongings.

The building was reviewed by two outside organizations and in both cases it was determined that this building does not meet the requirements of a historical building. As part of the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) review process required for potential future use of the property, the Texas Historical Commission determined that Capital Metro's proposed use of the property would have no effect on historical properties. We have provided the consultant's report regarding potential historical buildings on the site to Mr. Steve Sadowsky, the Historic Preservation Officer for the City of Austin for your review.

THE "TEXAS HISTORICAL COMMISSION" NEVER DETERMINED THESE BUILDING WERE INELIGIBLE FOR STATE HISTORIC RECOGNITION AS CAPITAL METRO AND THE COA HAS IMPLIED



TWENTY PROPERTIES. NUMBER 7 ON THE MAP IS THE PROPERTY WE HAVE HAD A DIALOGUE REGARDING FOR OVER A YEAR. ATTACHED ARE THREE OF THE HUNDREDS OF PAGES OF DOCUMENTS THAT ARE PUBLISHED ON THE CITY OF AUSTIN WEBSITE. FOR 13 MONTHS CAPITAL METRO HAS OPENLY STATED THAT THESE BUILDINGS HAVE BEEN DOCUMENTED TO HAVE NO HISTORIC SIGNIFICANCE. THESE DOCUMENTS WERE ONLY FOR THE RELOCATION OF THE TRACKS AND NOT FOR THE BUILDINGS.



Capital Metro, Endeavor still negotiating over Salttillo tract project

Endeavor Real Estate, by the narrowest of margins, won permission from the Capital Metro board in 2014 to build a mixture of housing, retail and a park on 10 acres in East Austin owned by the transit agency.

But more than 14 months later, Capital Metro and the Domain developer have yet to complete negotiations on a master development agreement for the long-planned project on the former rail yard just east of Interstate 35. Capital Metro had spent almost \$190,000 through June on outside legal help in hammering out the still incomplete agreement.

And the required relocation of a MetroRail track running through the center of the seven-block parcel, which agency officials had said would happen by the end of 2014, hasn't begun.

That preliminary step, at least, appears on the brink of occurring. The Capital Metro board on Monday will consider a \$6.4 million deal with Jay-Reese Contractors to move the track to the strip's south side, near East Fourth Street, and add a second track alongside it for about 2,000 feet. But even that movement forward — delayed by two previous bid attempts that first yielded no takers, and then only one bidder — could be hamstrung by lack of funding.

Capital Metro landed a \$4.3 million federal grant several years ago

the deal is finalized.

Endeavor, according to the minimal details provided publicly during the spring 2014 procurement battle with three other finalists, said it would build about 800 apartments on the site, with 25 percent of them defined as “affordable.” Endeavor’s pitch also included a 60,000-square-foot grocery store, 50,000 square feet of retail and a 1.7-acre park that would be dedicated to the city.


City Council Member Sabino “Pio” Renteria, whose District 3 includes the Salttillo tract, has been involved for years in discussions about what to do with the site. He and other neighborhood activists lobbied Capital Metro for well over a decade to develop the site in a way least likely to disrupt the area.

Renteria said it was his understanding that the deal has been held up, at least in part, by the need for the city to “vacate” ownership of short pieces of side streets such as Brushy, Medina and San Marcos that intrude into the site. Beyond that, Renteria said, Endeavor would now like permission to build a structure as high as 120 feet near I-35, an entitlement that losing bidder Salttillo Collaborative had said it wanted for a hotel. He also said that Endeavor, which at one time wanted to build the development in phases, now wants to do all of it in one phase.
