- 1. Process Used (Briefly describe what you did and when.)
- 2. Who participated? (Summarize the number and types of people, then if you like, you can append a list of the actual participants at the end.)
- 3. List of questions you asked
- 4. What you learned/heard categorized by interest. *Capture major themes that emerged and use one or two examples/quotes to illustrate those themes.*
 - a. Letting people know what power they DO have
 - b. More representative and fair "pulse"
 - c. Rich, 2-way communication
 - d. Time-realistic tools
 - e. Cultural relevance
 - f. Impact, accountability
 - g. Adequate resources
 - h. Clear, accessible information
 - i. Other (this is for themes that don't fit any of the above categories)
- 5. What our Subgroup thought were the most important "take-aways" from these data. (A few key bullet points.)

In an Appendix, you can put the list of participants if you have it, and if you want you can include more detail on the responses to the questions.
