PROPOSAL

Demolish a ca. 1946 house.

ARCHITECTURE

One-story, rectangular-plan, side-gabled stone-veneered frame house with a central, partial-width, shed-roofed, independent porch on plain, square wood posts; single 6:6 fenestration.

RESEARCH

The house was built in 1946 for Warren S. and Hilda Hood, who lived here until Hood's death in 1953. Warren Hood was born in Kansas; they had lived in Houston for at least 10 years before moving to Austin. He had been a painter in Houston and was a painter for the University of Texas upon moving to Austin. From the mid-1950s through the mid-1970s, the house was a rental unit, with tenants including students, cafeteria workers, and widows. Ruby Wimberly, a widow who worked for the Internal Revenue Service, moved into the house in the early 1970s; she is listed as the owner of the property thereafter. She was retired.

STAFF COMMENTS

The house is beyond the bounds of any City survey.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Encourage rehabilitation and adaptive re-use of this house; it is a classic example of vernacular post-World War II design, and reflects the architecture and social makeup of the neighborhood in its history and design. However, the house does not have sufficient architectural and historical significance to warrant individual designation as a historic landmark, so staff recommends release of the permit upon completion of a City of Austin Documentation Package, consisting of photographs of all elevations, a dimensioned sketch plan, and a narrative history, for archiving at the Austin History Center if rehabilitation and adaptive re-use is not a feasible option.

BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES

Warren S. and Hilda Hood (ca. 1946 – ca. 1953)

Warren S. and Hilda Hood appear in the 1940 U.S. Census of Houston, Texas, where they rented an apartment in what appears to have been a tri-plex. Warren S. Hood was 52, had been born in Kansas, and was a painter. Hilda Hood was 53, had been born in Texas, and had no occupation listed. They had a son, James, 14, who had been born in Texas. They had lived in University Place, Harris County, Texas, in 1935.

The 1930 U.S. Census shows Warren S. and Hilda Hood as the renters of a house in Houston, Texas. Warren S. Hood was 48, had been born in Kansas, and was the owner of a retail grocery store. Hilda Hood was 43, had been born in Texas, and was the owner of a rooming house. Their son, James W. Hood, was 4. They had 5 lodgers: Leon Meyer, 28, a Texas-born retail stationery salesman; Ethel Cherry, 22, a Texas-born waitress in a hotel; Merritt Smith, 37, a Georgia-born auto paint and polish salesman; Imogene Haltom, 19, a Texas-born drapery maker for a furniture store; and Robert E. Campbell, a 57-year old Tennessee-born widower who was a roofing salesman.

His 1917 World War I draft registration card shows that Warren Stanely Hood was living at Gray, Beaver County, Oklahoma. He had been born in Pratt County, Kansas in 1887, and was a U.S. Mail carrier. He was married, of medium height and build, had brown eyes and hair, and was partly bald.

His 1953 death certificate shows that Stanley Warren Hood was living at this house at the time of his death at the age of 66. He was a painter, who had been born in Kansas.
