### **PROJECT HISTORY**


- 855 properties at risk of flooding, limited access
- 1998 request to U.S. Army Corps of Engineers to conduct flood control study
- Austin voters approved \$2.4 million in bonds to buy floodprone homes near Onion Creek in 1998, buyouts began in 1999
- Corps study evaluated structural & non-structural solutions
- Structural solutions evaluated:
  - Detention
  - Channel modifications
  - Diversions
  - Levees/Floodwalls



### **PROJECT HISTORY**

- Preliminary structural alternative included:
  - Levees >11,000ft long and 10ft high
  - Diversion channels >5,000ft long and 250ft wide
  - Floodwall 3,500ft long, 15ft high
  - Flood gates
  - Would require acquisition of many properties for construction
- Varying levels of protection
- 2006 Feasibility Study recommended acquisition of 483 properties in 25-year floodplain, highest risk area





## **BUYOUT PROCESS**


- Individual meetings with property owners
- Appraisals, appraisal reviews
- Acquisition offer & relocation eligibility
- Tenant relocation eligibility, if applicable
- Replacement housing
- Asbestos testing/abatement, demolition
- Long-term land maintenance, compatible uses


WATERSHED PROTECTION


- Prior to 2006: 109 acquisitions, City funded
- **2006 2008: 114 acquisitions, FEMA grant**
- **2008 2013: 100 acquisitions, City funded**
- Cost: \$36.5M, including \$7.8M from FEMA grant
- (No federal funding from Army Corps until 2014)

As of October 2013: 323 acquisitions complete






















- November 2013 Recovery Buyout Program
  - \$19.6M to expedite purchase of most of remaining homes in the Corps buyout area
  - Funds identified through project savings and postponements
  - 104 properties acquired
- December 2014, May 2015, October 2015 USACE appropriations for project
  - \$23.5M to continue with acquisition of remaining 56 properties
  - 30 properties acquired as of end of October 2015
  - 26 properties remaining







- 372 properties outside Army Corps area at risk of flooding
  - 140 houses at risk in 25-year floodplain
  - 232 houses at risk in 100-year floodplain
- June 2014 Austin City Council approved \$35.5M for the 140 properties in the "25-Year Buyout Area"
- Acquisition process began in August 2014
- As of end of October 2015:
  - 117 properties acquired
  - 23 properties remaining





- September 2014 Austin City Council approved \$60M for the 232 properties in the "100-Year Buyout Area"
  - March 2015 Council authorized acquisitions
  - Buyouts began in June 2015
  - Phased approach, ~15-20 buyouts initiated per month
- March 2015 \$1.5M HMGP grant awarded, 9 properties
- As of end of October 2015:
  - 11 properties acquired
  - 221 properties remaining












- 31 properties have been acquired since the Oct 2015 flood
- Amendments to policies for post-flood conditions
- Process will be initiated for all interested owners by mid-2016
- Expedited buyout challenges:
  - Budget constraints
  - Austin housing market constraints
