Additional Backup Information

The Austin Nature & Science Center has provided educational opportunities to visitors for over 50 years to learn about the natural world in their backyards. Permanent exhibits include live animal displays, DinoPit, Nature of Austin, and the Naturalist Workshop. Traveling exhibits recently hosted, which were well received, include *Robot Zoo*, *Consertation Quest*, and *Viewfrom Space*.

Bee-liew it or Not! The Secret Lives of Honey Bees is a traveling exhibit sponsored by Purdue University. This exhibit teaches the importance of our pollinators, specifically the honey bees. The exhibit includes opportunities to:

- Learn what makes a honey bee a honey bee.
- Discover why pollination is important.
- Read about the threats to honey bees.
- Play a video game and learn who is a pollinator.
- Uncover the differences between bees and wasps.

The Austin Nature & Science Center approached Purdue University regarding their traveling exhibits and obtained specifications associated with the *Bee-lieve it or Not! The Secret Lives of Honey* exhibit size, text and layout. Purdue University offered the City a reduction of \$1,000 in transportation costs since Purdue staff will be traveling to Texas at that time and can provide transportation of the exhibit components at no cost.

This exhibit is consistent with current Austin Nature and Science Center environmental education content and will be placed near the much loved observation bee hive in the Austin Nature & Science Center. The Bee-liew it or Not! The Searet Lives of Honey Bees will complement the existing

- Observation bee hive (a 15 year permanent educational element)
- Pollinator gardens
- Monarch Way Stations inform

The Bee-liew it or Not! The Secret Lives of Honey Bees exhibit will be incorporated into programming with school science field trips and family events.

Because this contract is an interlocal agreement, the Austin City Council, as the governing body, must approve the execution of the agreement.
