- Request that PARD make an assessment of damage created by sponsored events at Zilker Park, because of over programming and mismanagement of the park by the City of Austin.
- Proposal for the use of Decker Lake at Walter E. Long Metropolitan Park for sculling. The citizen noted that that with some investment, the lake could be suitable to host regional and national events that could provide a substantial economic impact to the City through visitor dollars spent on shelter, food and sundries.

 Request by soccer organization for consideration of its use of two soccer fields at Circle C Metropolitan Park and that the agreement with the Lonestar Soccer Club of Austin not limit the soccer fields use to this group exclusively.
