- Green Infrastructure Requirements for landscaping and watershed that affect the ability to site new parks





IMAGINE AUSTIN PRIORITY TEAMS Code Diagnosis 2014

Community Character Manual – Section 3-8

- Defines a range of open space types found in the City using park type language from the 2011 Parks Long Range Plan
- Consultants would like us to add more park types such as greens, squares, and plazas to allowed types.

PARKLAND DEDICATION CODE Ordinance Changes 2014-2016

- Earlier decisions on land vs. fee in lieu / parkland deficient map
- Increased credit for private parkland to incentivize more recreation spaces
- Increased fees and land
- Clearer procedures for staff and developers


- Provided comments on open space concepts

infrastructure



STEP 4: OPEN SPACE AND THE CODE 2016

- Opticos hopes to address the following:
 - 1) Diversity of park type options
 - 2) Percentages of parkland provided in relation to the site (ie. 15% cap)
 - 3) The relationships of buildings on a site to the park space (ie. buildings should front the park space to activate it, rather than have the backs of buildings or other leftover features frame it)



STEP 4:

 Public Comment first item on agenda
 - Feb. 22 CAG discusses their work plan for public outreach and discussion
 - March 7 CAG discusses Built and Natural Environment
