- Develop strong internal and external partnerships.




Goal:

Over-arching Theme:


Businesses recognize the **need for organizing** joint ventures to improve and preserve their business area. However, **very few** organized business districts exist in Austin.

Priorities for Common Action:

- · Crime and safety
- Increase the opportunity for more bike and pedestrian friendly business environments
- Parking solutions (shared parking agreements, residential parking issues, etc.
- Affordability (rent and tax increase, short term leases)






