PROPOSAL

Demolish a ca. 1935 house.

ARCHITECTURE

One-story, rectangular-plan, side-gabled frame house with a central, partial-width front-gabled entry hood on ornamental metal posts; single 6:6 fenestration.

RESEARCH

The house was built in 1935 by a local developer. The first occupants, Paul and Vernie Duke, were renters, and lived here until around 1940. Paul Duke was a truck driver. Another truck driver, William H. Blundell, and his wife, Juanita, rented the house in the early 1940s. Around 1944, the house was purchased by Chester and Eltah Everhard, who lived here for the rest of their lives. Chester Everhard was a native of Taylor, Texas, but spent most of his life in Austin where he was an ornamental iron worker, working for J.M. Odom Construction Company, a general contractor, for many years.


STAFF COMMENTS

STAFF RECOMMENDATION



Chester L. and Eltah Everhard (ca. 1944 – ca. 1997)

Chester Everhard appears in the 1940 U.S. Census as the 28-year old divorced son of Abraham Everhard, who rented a house on East Avenue near E. 3rd Street in Austin. Chester Everhard had been born in Texas, and was a structural iron worker in the construction trade. His father, Abraham, was a widower with no occupation listed. His older brother, Roy Everhard, was a construction laborer. A younger brother, Ina, had no occupation listed.
