Proposal: Demolition of the building

Applicant: Kathleen Labay

City Staff: Beth Johnson, Historic Preservation Office, 974-7801

Staff Recommendation: Initiate historic zoning as the Slaugher-Dildy House is significant for its architecture and its association with Roy Slaughter, a principal of Brown Brothers, one of the city's most prominent banking institutions, and with Dr. Charles Dildy, a local physician. If the Historic Landmark Commission releases the permit, a City of Austin Documentation package should be submitted before the permit is released.

Laura Labay and Kathleen Dildy Labay spoke in support of demolition. Rosemary Merriam, Alexander Shoghi, Scott Barnes, and David Conner spoke in opposition to demolition.

MOTION: The public hearing was closed on a motion by Commissioner Reed. Commissioner Clites seconded the motion; vote 8-0.

Staff Recommendation: Release the application as submitted. The entire original house is being retained and only a small portion of the historic building will be affected. While the new building is much larger than the original house, it is being built with materials and details that are complimentary to the house.

Staff Recommendation: Release the application as submitted but encourage the applicants to consider keeping the roof form as a side gabled form to keep the original form of the house as well as retain the original stone veneer on the first floor. The retention of the original form would keep the architectural integrity of the home intact. This house does have a potential Historic Landmark Designation due to its historic associations with both Phillip Creer as well as Mike Michalske. Changing the roof form and removing the original siding would compromise the architecturally integrity of the house and possibly prevent it from being designated as a Landmark.

Rodney Bennett spoke in favor of the application. There were no speakers in opposition. The public hearing was closed on a motion by Commissioner Tollett. Commissioner Clites seconded the motion; vote 8-0.
