# Federal Funds + Requirements

The City of Austin receives four formula block grants from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), to help address affordable housing, community and economic development needs.










**ESG** 

- Regulatory requirements include affirmatively furthering fair housing choice in Austin.
- As a participating jurisdiction, the City of Austin is required to submit a 5-year Consolidated Plan, Action Plans (1 per year), and End-of-Year Reports called the CAPER (1 per year).

## What is the CAPER?



- At the end of each Fiscal Year, the City prepares a Consolidated Annual Performance and Evaluation Report (CAPER) that provides information to HUD and the public about accomplishments made possible with federal funding.
- ► FY 2014-15 CAPER was submitted to HUD electronically on December 22, 2015 through eCon Planning Suite, a part of HUD's Integrated Disbursement and Information System. IDIS is the draw down and reporting system for formula block grants.


# FY 2014-15 Expenditures



- ► The City of Austin expects to receive continued federal funding from HUD for Fiscal Year 2016-17. The Action Plan serves as the City's application to access these resources.
- ► Annual Action Plans outline the actions, activities, and resources that will be used to address the needs of low-to moderate-income families.
- ► At the end of each Fiscal Year, the City prepares a Consolidated Annual Performance and Evaluation Report (CAPER) that includes annual performance metrics.

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






Federal formula grant allocations between 2010 and 2015 are displayed below with the percent change for this time period. HUD is expected to release the 2016 allocation in mid-February.
