Additional Backup Information

This action will approve execution of an amendment to the interlocal between the City of Austin and the University of Texas at Austin to add approximately 10 additional months to the term. The current term of the interlocal is November 27, 2012 – November 26, 2015. The City received a one-year grant period extension with a new end date of September 30, 2016. The University of Texas at Austin has agreed to extend the term of the interlocal agreement and conclude their activities on September 30, 2016, with no additional funding beyond the original \$300,000.
