PROCESS

Applications for admission must be submitted to the Veterans Court Administrator by the defense attorney representing the veteran.

Once a referral is received, the Veteran's Court Manager will screen the applicant for eligibility, schedule the veteran for assessment and staff the case with the County Attorney's Office.

If the veteran meets the program criteria and is accepted into the program, their case is transferred to the Veterans Court docket in CC#4.

A Strategic Action Plan (SAP) will be developed by the program manager and the veteran will be provided with referrals for services needed to begin implementation of the SAP.

The veteran will be scheduled for a series of court appearances to monitor and reinforce their progress toward meeting the objectives of their SAP. Once the objectives have been successfully met, the case will be dismissed.
