### ATX Campaign Finance Form Review

- Goal: Accommodate data provided in the ATX forms in the Campaign Finance Database Initiative
  - Avoid duplicate data
  - Develop clear and consistent reporting timelines
  - Redesign the forms to simplify collecting electronic data

#### Methodology

- Side-by-side comparison of ATX forms and the Texas Ethics Commission (TEC) forms
- Examination of reporting requirements listed in Chapter 2-2 of the Austin City Code
- Review of deadlines for TEC and ATX form submission

## Current ATX Campaign Finance Forms

- ▶ ATX.1: Independent Expenditures Not by a Candidate
- ▶ ATX.2: Personal Funds Loans and Expenditures
- ▶ **ATX.3**: Campaign Debt Reconciliation
- ATX.4: Bank Reconciliation
- ▶ **ATX.5**: Bundling Report
- ▶ **ATX.6**: Exemption Statement
- ▶ **ATX.7**: Special Pre-Election Report

#### Overall Observations

#### Inconsistent Filing Deadlines

- Some ATX forms align with TEC reporting deadlines
- Others are tied to monetary thresholds

### Duplicate/Redundant Information

Some ATX forms collect information that is reported on TEC Schedules

### Complexity

 Some ATX forms combine multiple data types (contributions and expenditures) or sources (candidates and committees)

#### Overall Recommendations

#### Streamline Filing Deadlines

 Align ATX reporting deadlines with state reporting periods, including pre-election report deadlines

### **▶ Eliminate Duplicate/Redundant Information**

 Where possible, remove redundant reporting requirements while maintaining transparency

#### Reduce Complexity

- Clarify who must file each report
- Re-design ATX forms to match the structure of TEC forms to support systematic data capture

### Recommendation: Reporting Periods

- Align Austin's reporting schedule with the TEC's reporting requirements
  - January 15
  - July 15
  - > 30th day before an election
  - 8th day before an election
  - 8th day before a runoff election
  - Pre-election reporting period
    - ▶ 9th day before an election through 5:00pm the day before an election
    - Triggered when amount thresholds are met

### ATX.1: Independent Expenditures

- ▶ § 2-2-32, Reporting of Independent Expenditures
- Form ATX.1 is used to disclose independent expenditures that support/oppose a candidate or ballot measure
- Rolling filing deadlines
  - Before 60th day (5 days), 60th day to 9th day (2 days), 9th day to election day (1 day)
- Recommended Code changes:
  - Eliminate filing requirement for committees
  - Adopt reporting deadlines that align with the State's reporting schedule

### ATX.1: Independent Expenditures

- Who will be required to disclose these expenditures?
  - Individuals, businesses, and other entities not required to file reports under the Texas Election Code
- Modify reporting deadlines
  - Eliminate threshold-based reporting requirement
  - Adopt TEC reporting deadlines
  - Apply updated pre-election reporting requirement

#### ATX.2: Personal Funds

§ 2-2-27, Disclosure of Loans from a Candidate or Officeholder and Expenditures from the Funds of a Candidate or Officeholder

#### Form ATX.2 is used to disclose:

- Campaign expenditures from the personal funds of a candidate or officeholder
- Loans from personal funds to a candidate's campaign

### Reporting periods

- Date of declared candidacy to 12am on 10th day (7 days)
- ▶ 10th day before election until election day (1 day)

#### ATX.2: Personal Funds

- Recommendation: Move the ATX.2 reporting requirement to the pre-election reporting period
  - Outside the pre-election reporting period, this information is already disclosed on:

**TEC Schedule E**, Loans (including loans made from personal funds)

**TEC Schedule G**, Political Expenditures Made From Personal Funds

### ATX.3: Campaign Debt Reconciliation

- ▶ § 2-2-42, Annual Reconciliation of Campaign Debt
- Form ATX.3 is used to disclose:
  - For loans and campaign debt, the name of the creditor, the principal amount owed, the interest rate, and the date of maturity
  - Campaign debt in existence as of the first and last day of each calendar year

# ATX.3: Campaign Debt Reconciliation

- Recommendation: Eliminate this reporting requirement
- This information is already disclosed on:

**TEC Schedule E**, Loans (The name of the creditor, date of the loan, principal amount, interest rate, maturity date, guarantor information)

**TEC Schedule F1**, Political Expenditures Made From Political Contributions (Loan payments)

**TEC Form C/OH, Section 6, Outstanding Loan Totals** Total principal amount of all outstanding loans as of the last day of the reporting period

#### ATX.4: Bank Reconciliation

- § 2-2-25, Annual Reconciliation Filing By Candidates and Campaign Committees
- Form ATX.4 is used to disclose:
  - Checks issued but not cleared
  - Interest and dividends earned
  - Checks received but not deposited
  - Checks deposited but dishonored by the contributor's bank
  - Bank account balances as of the first and last day of each calendar year

#### ATX.4: Bank Reconciliation

- Recommendation: Eliminate this reporting requirement
- This information is disclosed on:

**TEC Schedule F1**, Political Expenditures Made From Political Contributions

TEC Schedule F2, Unpaid Incurred Obligations

**TEC Form C/OH, Section 5, Contribution Balance**Total contributions maintained as of the last day of the reporting period

**TEC Schedule K**, Interest, Credits, Gains, Refunds, and Contributions Returned to Filer

### ATX 5: Bundling Report

- ▶ § 2-2-22, Fundraising and Bundling By Intermediaries
- No recommended changes at this time, aside from updating the form's design
- Data will not be uploaded into the Campaign Finance Database in this project phase
  - Pending clarification of:
    - Definition of bundling activity and associated reporting requirements
    - Connections between lobbyist activity and bundling

### ATX.6: Exemption Statement

- ▶ § 2-2-26, Filing of Campaign Finance Data
- Filed in lieu of submitting a data file for each campaign finance report
- Recommended Code changes clarify:
  - Who can file an exemption statement
  - Conditions under which the exemption is permitted
  - Requirements for candidates when they no longer qualify for the exemption

# ATX.6: Exemption Statement

- Who can file an exemption statement?
  - A candidate or an officeholder running for re-election
- Conditions under which the exemption is permitted
  - Report's due date falls within the campaign period
  - Candidate has not signed the campaign contract
  - ▶ The candidate has not raised and does not intend to raise more than \$10K in contributions during the campaign period
- Requirements for candidates if they no longer qualify
  - Submit a data file for each subsequent report
  - Submit a data file for each prior report due during the campaign period before the contributions exceeded \$10K

### ATX.7: Pre-election Report

- § 2-2-29, Special Pre-election Reports
- Form ATX.7 is currently used to disclose transactions between the 9th day before an election and the day before an election
  - Candidates who accept contributions totaling >\$10K
    - Contributions
  - Committees who accept contributions totaling >\$2.5K or make expenditures totaling >\$1K
    - Contributions
    - Expenditures

### ATX.7: Pre-election Report

#### Recommendations:

- Combine the ATX.1 (for committees), ATX.2, and ATX.7 reporting requirements into a comprehensive Pre-election Report
- Clarify reporting requirements for candidates and committees

### Proposed Pre-election Reports

- ATX.PE-COH: Pre-election Report Candidates and Officeholders
  - ▶ ATX.7A: Pre-election Report of Contributions
  - ATX.7E: Pre-election Report of Loans From Personal Funds
  - ATX.7G: Pre-election Report of Expenditures From Personal Funds
- ▶ ATX.PE-PAC: Pre-election Report Committees
  - ATX.7A: Pre-election Report of Contributions
  - ▶ ATX.7F: Pre-election Report of Expenditures

#### Status

- Clerk's Office staff briefed Ethics Review Commission
  February 10, 2016
  - ERC recommended adoption of the proposed changes on a 10-0 vote
- Clerk's Office staff drafting revised ATX forms
  - Creation of fillable PDF documents
  - Testing extraction of data from the PDF forms
  - Verifying compatibility with the Campaign Finance Database data formats and validation tools

#### Status

- ▶ Brief Council on Code revisions March 29, 2016
- ▶ Council vote March 31, 2016
- If approved, Clerk's Office will:
  - Finalize the new form designs
  - Submit the new forms to the Ethics Review Commission for approval (April 13, 2016)
  - Include new forms and instructions in the City Clerk's Candidate Packet (May 6, 2016)
  - Incorporated data into the Campaign Finance Database Initiative Phase II (July 15, 2016)
