

ETHICS REVIEW COMMISSION MINUTES

REGULAR CALLED MEETING Wednesday, March 9th, 2016

The Ethics Review Commission ("Commission") convened in a regular meeting on Wednesday, March 9, 2016, at City Hall, 301 W. 2nd Street, Room 1027, in Austin, Texas.

Commission Chair Peter Einhorn called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

Item No. 1: There were no speakers for general citizen communication.
