Additional Backup Information						
For the past 10 years, the City of Austin has served as the emergency shelter for hurricane evacuees from the City of Galveston. Under this agreement "point-to-point" evacuees consist of persons who reside in the City of Galveston and do not have their own transportation to flee major hurricanes.						
This agreement renews this arrangement with the City of Galveston. Up to 1200 evacuees may come to Austin from the City of Galveston under this agreement for a period of 3 to 5 days. These evacuees are typically sheltered in Austin Convention Center or Palmer Events Center facilities.						
It is expected that the State of Texas will reimburse the City of Austin for all reasonable expenses it incurs to temporarily shelter City of Galveston evacuees who come to Austin during a mandatory evacuation, when the State of Texas Division of Emergency Management has activated the State's emergency sheltering system.
