Common goal of improving quality of life by reducing health disparities and working towards Health Equity.


Health Disparity

A particular type of health difference that is closely linked with social, economic, and/or environmental disadvantage.

In Austin/Travis County:

- Black Americans have disproportionately higher rates of HIV and other sexually transmitted disease and are more likely to die from HIV than other groups
- Blacks and Hispanics have higher rates of diabetes
- The number of teen births to Hispanics is seven times the number of teen births compared to Whites, and approximately six times the number of teen births compared to Blacks
