Additional Backup Information							
Caritas of Austin (Caritas) administers the Best Single Source Plus Collaborative (BSS+C) program, consisting of 13 partner							
agencies. The BSS+C program provides individuals and families in Austin/Travis County with comprehensive housing							
stability resources inclusive of case management and basic needs services. This program ensures that clients have access to basic necessities, starting with housing and extending to food, clothing, physical/mental health care, and other supportive							
services.							
The City previously entered into a \$10,592,283 multiyear agreement with Caritas. The BSS+C program was requested to provide services to individuals and families affected by the Onion Creek floods in October 2015. Through the flood recovery							
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response, the BSS+C program redirected funding originally planned for individuals and families who were assessed for imminent housing stability crisis to victims of the Onion Creek floods. Services provided to the flood victims are the same as							

provided by the BSS+C program. The funding of \$65,000 in this amendment will enable Caritas, through the BSS+C program, to serve the originally planned target population, as well as the additional individuals and families affected by the Onion Creek floods in October 2015. The new total amount for the current 12-month term of this agreement is \$3,595,761.
