Themes raised thus far:

Fair Housing:

Q: How might we affirmatively further fair housing goals through our development patterns? Ensure broad housing choice in all types of neighborhoods?

Increased entitlements and unintended consequences:

Q: How can we balance development pressure and neighborhood context?

Density and affordability:

Q: How might we increase affordability in concert with increased density?

Greenfield and Infill development:

Q: How might we calibrate growth and density in both greenfield and infill areas?

Density and infrastructure:

Q: How can we ensure our infrastructure supports increased density?
