PROJECT SPECIFICATIONS

The applicant proposes the construction of a 1,107 square foot addition to the 2,120 square foot house. The attached garage and sunroom will be demolished to accommodate the proposed addition. The proposed addition will be 1 story, with a hipped roof matching the pitch of the existing roof on the house. The walls of the addition will be stucco with horizontal fenestration close to the eaves.

RESEARCH




STAFF COMMENTS

STAFF RECOMMENDATION


Release the partial demolition and building permits as proposed.


