A request has been received from Signor Enterprises on behalf of Dean R McWilliams to construct a boat dock at 203 Lago Verde Dr.

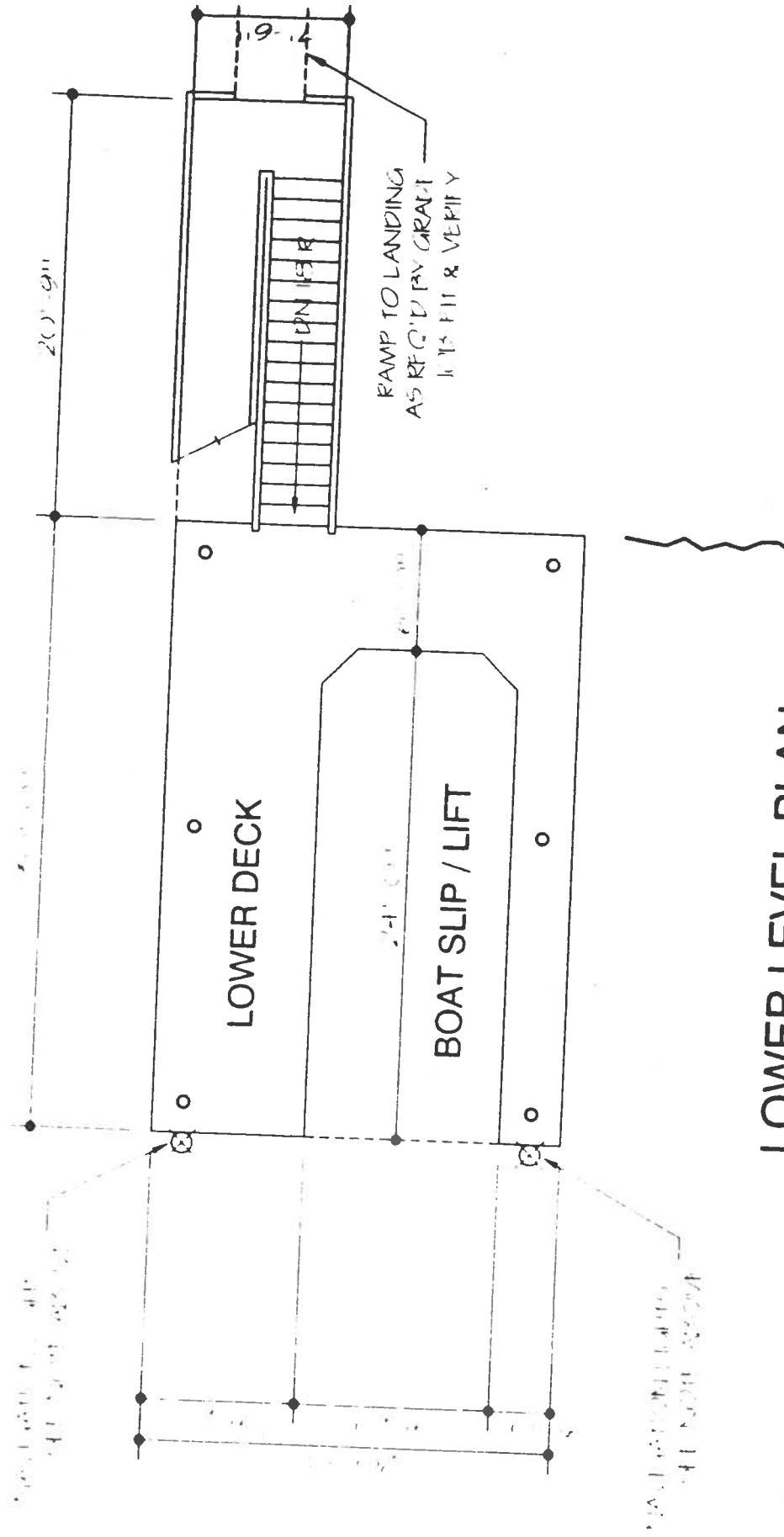
