B. Current Status in the Draft Report (P.15) in Asian American Quality of Life Survey:

CHAPTER 3: FINDINGS

During the survey implementation phase, a total of 2,614 individuals participated in the survey. Removing 5 cases with more than 20% of missing information, 2,609 participants were included in the analysis. The following section summarizes the descriptive findings of the overall sample and sub-ethnic groups by the organized themes.

3. 1. Ethnic Composition and Survey Language of the Overall Sample

Table 5 presents the ethnic composition of the sample and the languages used in the survey. The sample includes 640 Chinese, 574 Asian Indians, 471 Koreans, 513 Vietnamese, 265 Filipinos, and 146 Asians of other ethnic backgrounds. Examples of the ethnicities specified by participants in the 'other' group were Nepalese, Pakistani, Bangladeshi, Cambodian, Hmong, Indonesian, Japanese, Laotian, Burmese, Sri Lankan, Thai, and mixed ethnicity. The Chinese sample included people from China (52.4%), Taiwan (37.0%), and other areas, such as Hong Kong, Macau, Singapore, and Malaysia (10.6%).

It is noteworthy that almost half of the participants (48.5%) used other language versions of the survey questionnaire rather than English. Being used by 17% of the overall sample, Chinese (including both traditional and simplified versions) was the most frequently used, followed by Korean (14.2%) and Vietnamese (14%).

- (1) Two survey forms are confusing. See attached two survey forms. Check Numbers of forms (#10620 vs. #40267).
- (2) Assuming Taiwanese is a part of Chinese is inappropriate.
- (3) U.S. CIA web site (6-17-16) indicates 84% of people of Taiwan are Taiwanese.
- (4) Taiwan survey (4-26-16) inciates that 84% of people of Taiwan are Taiwanese.
- (5) If Asian population (6.6% of Texas population) is significant to Texas population,
- the Taiwanese population (9% of Austin Asian population) is even more significant to Austin Asian population.
- (6) Taiwanese population (9%) is very close to Filipinos (10%). "Asians of other Ethnic backgroundss" is 6%.
- (7) A separate Taiwanese category can be done easily. See Item D. above.
- (8) Throwing out Taiwanese samples or any others in the survey is totally against the purpose of survey.
