PROPOSAL

Demolish a ca. 1948 house.

ARCHITECTURE

One-story, rectangular-plan, side-gabled frame house with a prominent front-gabled independent porch; single and paired 1:1 fenestration, mostly replacement windows.

RESEARCH


Although the building permit for this house references a masonry structure, there does not seem to be any evidence that masonry was ever applied to this house. The first tenant was Henrietta Hill, who had no occupation listed in the city directories. Henrietta Hill was married to Charles A. Hill, and before this house was built, they lived next door with Charles' mother, Alberta Hill, at 1604 Walnut Avenue. Henrietta Hill is not listed in city directories after the mid-1940s, and by the late 1940s, the directories show Charles and Dorothy Hill as the owners of this house. Charles Hill was a laborer; the 1940 U.S. Census shows him as a general laborer in construction and yard work. By the early1950s, Charles Hill was working as a porter in the Austin National Bank on Congress Avenue, a job he held until the early 1960s. He then became a janitor at the State Board of Control. He and his wife, Dorothy, divorced in 1975, and Dorothy Hill lived in this house until at least the early 1990s. She was a nurse's aide at the University of Texas.


STAFF COMMENTS

STAFF RECOMMENDATION



BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES

Charles A. and Henrietta Hill

Charles A. and Dorothy Hill

The 1940 U.S. Census shows Charles A. and Henrietta Hill living with his mother, Alberta Hill, next door at 1604 Walnut Avenue. Charles A. Hill was 29, had been born in Texas, and was a general laborer in construction and yard work. Henrietta Hill was 18, had been born in Texas, and had no occupation listed. They had a son, Charles A. Hill, Jr., 9 months, and a daughter, Benja Shirley. Charles' mother, Alberta Hill was a 54-year old widow who had been born in Texas and worked as a housekeeper in a private home.

The 1930 U.S. Census shows Charles A. Hill as the 20-year old son of Alberta Hill, who owned her home at 1604 Walnut Avenue. Charles A. Hill is listed as a Texas-born laborer for a private family. His mother, Alberta Hill, was a 40-year old Texas-born divorcee who worked as a laundress for a private family.

Charles A. and Dorothy J. Hill were married March 14, 1949 and divorced on May 14, 1975 in Travis County, according to Texas divorce records.

HILL, Charles, 89, of Austin died Sunday. Services 2 p.m. Saturday, St. James Baptist Church. Burial Evergreen Cemetery. Arrangements by King-Tears.
