PROPOSAL

Demolish a ca. 1923 house.

ARCHITECTURE

One-story, rectangular-plan, double side-gabled frame house with prominent clipped gables on the side of the house; round-arched entry hood; windows have been boarded up, but do not appear to be original.

RESEARCH

The house was built around 1923. The first tenants were Clarence W. and Rose Payne, who lived here until around 1926. Clarence W. Payne was the chief clerk at the Department of State.


From around 1926 through the mid-1990s, the house was owned and occupied by member of the Wiley E. Glaze family. Wiley E. and Kathleen Glaze moved in here just after their marriage; he was an instructor in physical training for men at the University of Texas, and worked under legendary athletic director Theo Bellmont. Their daughter, Kathleen, married a public school teacher turned UT professor, Bob Ables; they lived in this house after Wiley and Kathleen Glaze passed away. Kathleen Ables was an executive assistant at the University of Texas for many years.


STAFF COMMENTS

The house is listed in the Comprehensive Cultural Resources Survey (1984) but without a priority for research.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION


Architecturally, this is a very unusual house that also has a long history with Wiley Glaze of the athletic department at the University of Texas. Staff recommends rehabilitation and adaptive re-use, then strongly recommends relocation over demolition, but release of the permit upon completion of a City of Austin Documentation Package, consisting of photographs of all elevations, a dimensioned sketch plan, and a narrative history, for archiving at the Austin History Center.

BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES

Clarence W. and Rose Payne (ca. 1923 – ca. 1925)

The 1920 U.S. Census shows C.W. and Rose Payne living in a rented house at 606 W. 18th Street in Austin. C.W. Payne was 49, had been born in Tennessee and was an auditor for the state. Rose Payne was 49, had been born in Alabama, and had no occupation listed. They had a daughter, Mina Belle, 22, who had been born in Texas and had no occupation listed.

Clarence W. and Rose Payne appear in the 1930 U.S. Census as the renters of a duplex in San Antonio, Texas. Clarence W. Payne was 55, had been born in Tennessee, and was an attorney in corporation law. Rose Payne was 55, had been born in Alabama, and had no occupation listed. They had no children listed with them. The 1940 U.S. Census shows the Paynes living in the same duplex in San Antonio. Neither had an occupation listed.

His 1943 death certificate shows that Clarence William Payne had been living in San Antonio for the last 12 years. He was born in 1872 in Tennessee, and was a charter writer for businesses. He was buried in Austin.

Rose Sarah Payne's 1968 death certificate shows that she was living at 1405 Wooldridge Drive at the time of her death at the age of 96. She was born in 1871 in Cherokee, Alabama, and was a housewife. Her daughter was Mrs. Goodall S. Wooten, Sr.

Wiley and Kathleen Glaze (ca. 1925 - ca. 1968)

The 1920 U.S. Census shows Wylie E. Glaze as the 28-year old son of Louis N. and Georgia Glaze, who owned their farm in Jones County, Texas. Wylie was the oldest of the couple's 5 children. He is listed as a farm laborer on the home farm. His father, Louis Glaze, 51, had been born in Missouri and is listed as a farmer. His mother, Georgia Glaze, 47, was born in Arkansas, and had no occupation listed. Wylie's next younger brother, Willie, 19, is also listed as a farm laborer. The 1910 U.S. Census also shows an 18-year old Wiley as a farm laborer on the home farm in Jones County. This

census report also reveals that there were 3 children between Wiley and Willie – Velma, 16; John H., 13; and T.C., 11. The two younger boys were also farm laborers.

The 1920 U.S. Census shows Kathleen Morrall (Glaze) as the 22-year old daughter of Ben and Della Morrall who owned their home at 1410 E. 1st Street in Austin. Ben Morrall had been born in England and was a cashier for Western Union. Della Morrall had been born in Texas to German-born parents and had no occupation listed. Kathleen Morrall had been born in Texas and had no occupation listed.

Wiley E. and Kathleen Glaze are listed in the 1930 U.S. Census as the owners of this house, which was worth \$9,000. Wiley E. Glaze was 38, had been born in Texas, and was a teacher at the University of Texas. Kathleen Glaze was 33, had been born in Texas, and had no occupation listed. They had a daughter, Kathleen A., 2, who had been born in Texas.

The 1940 U.S. Census shows Wiley E. and Kathleen Glaze as the owners of this house, which was worth \$6,000. Wiley E. Glaze was 48, had been born in Texas, and was an instructor at the state university. Kathleen Glaze was 43, had been born in Texas, and had no occupation listed. They had a daughter, Kathleen, 12, who had been born in Texas.

Her 1966 death certificate shows that Kathleen Morrall Glaze was living in this house at the time of her death. She was born in 1897 in Austin, and was a housewife.

His 1968 death certificate shows that Wiley Eugene Glaze was living in this house at the time of his death. He was born in 1891 in Pike, Texas, and was a physical education teacher at the University of Texas. He was a widower. Mrs. Kathleen Ables was his daughter. He had lived in Austin since 1921.

He worked under Bellmont until Bellmont's retirement then remained in the athletic department at UT until his own retirement in 1962. LUTHER ROBERT ABLES Born July 30, 1923 in Tyler, Texas Died January 1, 2004 in San Antonio, Texas

Luther Robert "Bob" ABLES, son of a newspaper printer, Luther Richmond ABLES and Elizabeth (EASLEY) ABLES, was born 30 July 1923 in Tyler, Smith County, Texas and passed away 1 January 2004 in San Antonio, Bexar County, Texas.

Bob graduated from Hubbard High School, in Hubbard, Bowie County, Texas in 1940 and enrolled in Wesleyan College to study journalism. His work was interrupted in 1942, however, by World War II when he entered the U. S. Naval Air Corps. He served in the Pacific Theater as a navigator and pilot until 1945 and was awarded the Air Medal and the Victory Medal.

After the war, Bob resumed his studies, enrolling at the University of Texas at Austin where he was a member of the Sigma Phi Epsilon fraternity. He earned his Bachelor of journalism degree in 1949 and began his journalism career, a career that took him to jobs with the Corpus Christi <u>Caller-Times</u> in Corpus Christi, Texas, the Cleveland <u>Advocate</u> in Cleveland, Texas, and the Mexico City <u>News</u> in Mexico City, Mexico. While in this latter job, he pursued and earned his Master of Arts Degree in Political Science, graduating cum laude from Mexico City College in 1955.

During his academic career, Bob was also honored as a Kellogg Fellow, and as a member of Phi Delta Kappa, Phi Alpha Theta, and Sigma Delta Chi.

After completing his college work in 1955, Bob took a job teaching history and journalism at Luther Burbank High School in San Antonio, Texas. This job stirred his passion for his true calling, causing him to seek employment at the University of Texas at Austin.

While teaching in the Department of History at the University, Bob met Kathleen "Kitty" GLAZE, who also worked in the Department of History, and they were married on September 12, 1959. Together, they were the proud parents of one son and one daughter.

Bob later became an associate professor of History and Government at Amarillo College in Amarillo, Texas and at Tarrant County Junior College in Fort Worth, Texas. He returned to The University of Texas to complete his PhD in Educational Administration in 1970. He wrote articles for various Texas historical journals and continued to teach in colleges and secondary schools until he retired.

Bob's obituary appeared in the 16 January 2004 edition of the Austin <u>American-Statesman</u>, Austin, Texas.
