PROPOSAL

Demolish a ca. 1948 house.

ARCHITECTURE

One-story, wing-and-gable plan frame house with a partial-width shed-roofed independent porch on ornamental metal supports; a fixed-sash picture window to the left of the front door has replaced a set of original windows shown in photographs as recently as April, 2015. Other fenestration consists of single and paired 1:1 windows with decorative wood screens.

RESEARCH

The house was built in 1948 by O.J. Hinton, and purchased by E. Clyde and Lucille Spencer, who lived here until around 1960. E. Clyde Spencer was a truck driver for Superior Dairies when he and Lucille bought this house; soon thereafter, he became a bookkeeper and then an accountant for the Texas State Game Fish and Oyster Commission. Lucille Spencer was a clerk for the State Employment Commission.

After the Spencers moved out, the house became a rental property with a variety of tenants, including an electrician, students, and computer programmers.


STAFF COMMENTS
