

CAMPO REGION

- Six counties encompassing 5,302 square miles
- 2 million people
- 12,420 lane miles of roadway
- 44.6 million miles traveled by vehicles every day
- 31.2 million transit boarding each year



METROPOLITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATIONS

- Required in areas 50,000+ population
- Develop a multi-modal, 20-year regional transportation plan
- Set policy and guide the transportation planning process
- Provide a forum for project selection by local officials for federal funds



CAMPO PLANNING DOCUMENTS

- Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) CAMPO 2040
 Plan
 - o Updated every 5 years
 - o Covers at least 20-year horizon
 - o Includes roads, transit, bike, and pedestrian
- Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) 2017-2020 TIP
 - o Covers 4 years
 - o Must be consistent with long-range plan
 - o Funding must be identified for each project



CAMPO STRUCTURE





TPB ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- Set and implement policies for regional planning
- Select projects needing federal funding assistance
- Identify and implement priorities and performance measures



TAC ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- Advise and make recommendations to TPB on technical issues
- Recommend project priorities for Regional
 Transportation Plan (RTP) and Transportation
 Improvement Program (TIP)



CAMPO STAFF ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- Coordinate with regional governments,
 agencies, and partners in regional planning
- Provide information, technical analysis, and recommendations to TPB and TAC
- Develop and implement robust community outreach programs
- Manage Planning Processes

UTC PARTICIPATION IN CAMPO PLANNING

- Submit ideas and thoughts to Mayor, Council, and other TPB members
- Participate in CAMPO open houses and public comment opportunities
- Speak at TPB meetings



CURRENT COMMUNITY OUTREACH

Comment period now open for amendments to the CAMPO 2040 Plan and 2017-2020 TIP

- Twice a year local jurisdictions have opportunity to submit changes to their projects
- Changes are primarily for projects already in the plans
- No funding for new projects this time
 - If a project is locally funded it may be added
- 39 requested amendments to CAMPO 2040 Plan
- 93 requested amendments to the TIP
