Subject: Director's Monthly Report to the Zero Waste Advisory Commission

Textile Recycling - Simple Recycling

The City of Austin and Austin Resource Recovery has entered into an agreement with Simple Recycling for textile recycling. The contract was competitively bid and Simple Recycling was the selected bidder. Simple Recycling currently performs this service with several Midwest cities, and also has contracts with Sugar Land (Houston area) and Haltom City (DFW), Texas. Austin will be the largest city they have contracted with to date.

In this program, Simple Recycling will follow ARR's recycling routes. They will provide a bag in which the customers will place their clothing or other items. This bag will be placed near the curb in the vicinity of their recycling cart. The bags will be collected by Simple Recycling personnel and taken to their local (to be determined) facility. There, they will be weighed and sorted. Diversion will be tracked through reports sent to ARR. After the bags are emptied, the bags will be stored and periodically delivered to the ARR Recycle and ReUse Drop-Off Center to be recycled. If citizens need additional bags, they will be able to call in and have bags sent to them.

There will also be a Simple Recycling drop-off box at the Recycle and ReUse Drop-Off Center if people desire to drop items off rather than put them at the curb.

The program is scheduled to begin December 5, 2016. There will be an informational post card mailed to residents November 14, 2016 and a packet with information and bag mailed November 28, 2016.

Simple Recycling will perform a "dry run" two weeks prior to the start date to familiarize themselves with the routes, and verify their personnel and equipment needs.

The service is free to City of Austin residents, and The City of Austin will be paid \$20.00 per ton of material.

ARR FY17 Budget Approved

City Council adopted the Austin Resource Recovery proposed FY17 budget and fee schedule on September 14th without reductions or changes. The previous budget presentations to ZWAC represent the key elements of the approved budget. The FY17 fiscal year began October 1, 2016 and ends September 30, 2017.

Of primary interest is the adoption of the Organics collection program, with a city-wide five year roll-out of food waste and yard trimmings co-collection (2016-2020). To initiate the startup of the organics collection expansion, ARR will be bringing forward truck and cart purchases to ZWAC and City Council in the coming months. Additional personnel will be hired in April, with a Spring/Summer rollout.

In addition, Council adopted a city employee pay package that includes a \$0.29 per hour pay increase as well as a 2% base pay increase, effective in December 2016. The City living wage was raised from \$13.03 to \$13.50 per hour. The new costs associated with these pay increases were anticipated and previously built into the ARR proposed budget as presented to City Council.

In the adoption of the Parks and Recreation Department (PARD) annual budget, park recycling was not discussed or introduced by Council. Thus, the FY17 PARD budget does not allocate new funding for recycling in the parks. This topic was of strong interest to ZWAC, and could be discussed in the coming months for recommendations in the formation of the FY18 PARD budget.

ARR is scheduled for review by the Office of Performance Management beginning in October. As the process is just beginning, there is not much to report. I will be scheduling the OPM to present to ZWAC in January or February, so that the Commission may have input into the review. This timing will also allow for impact on the FY18 budget formation process.

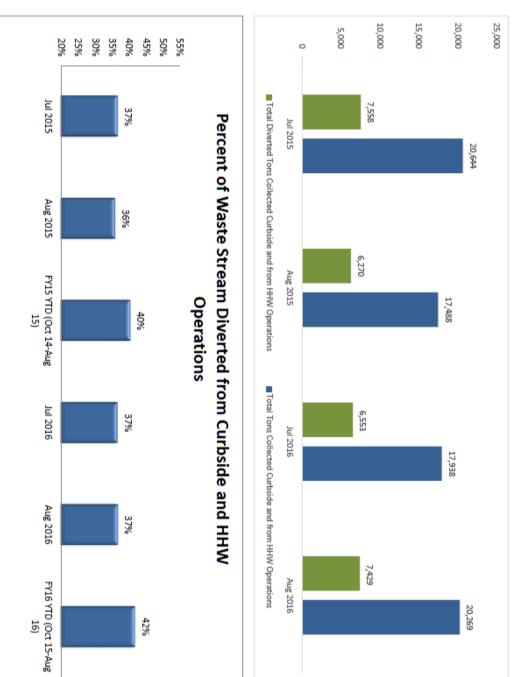
Actions Taken by City Council since last ZWAC Meeting

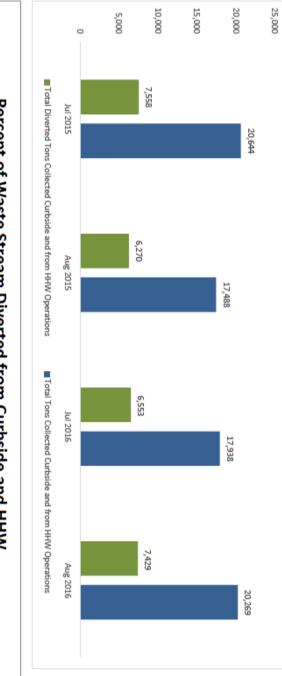
Austin Water Bio-solids Contract: A recommendation on bio-solids management was developed by the ZWAC at their August 10 meeting and communicated to Council. At the Council meeting on August 11, a vote was held to postpone the related items to a later Council date so staff and stakeholders could engage in policy conversations while contract negotiation continued. On September 14th at the joint Water/Wastewater Commission/ZWAC meeting an action was taken to create a joint working group from the two commissions and to return to the respective commissions with recommendations at their October 12th meetings, necessitating further postponement of the related agreements.
