## **RESOLUTION NO.**

WHEREAS, the Imagine Austin Comprehensive plan endeavors to create healthy and family-friendly communities through development that includes a mix of land uses and housing types, affords realistic opportunities for transit, bicycle, and pedestrian travel, and provides community gathering spaces, neighborhood gardens and family farms, parks, and safe outdoor play areas for children; and

WHEREAS, the City's Families and Children Task Force determined in 2008 that Austin should offer families of all incomes, ages, and abilities access to safe, attractive, and well-maintained parks or public open green spaces because parks and cultural amenities contribute significantly to a child's well-being and to the family-oriented character of a community; and

WHEREAS, in 2015 the City's Office of Sustainability reported that Districts 1, 2, 3, and 4 have the highest rates of food assistance, which suggests that these districts have limited access to fresh and healthy food; and

WHEREAS, according to the 2010 United States Census, District 1 has a population of 26.9% under the age of 18, District 2 has a population of 31.1% under the age of 18, District 3 has a population of 21.8% under the age of 18, and District 4 has a population of 28.7% under the age of 18; and

**WHEREAS,** a majority of mobile home parks in the City are located within Council Districts 1, 2, 3, and 4; and

**WHEREAS,** Section 25-2-1205 of the City Code requires a mobile home park to include a certain amount of open space between mobile home sites; and

WHEREAS, Section 25-2-1220 of the City Code requires a mobile home park to include a recreation area such as a playground, swimming pool, or community building, but does not require a mobile home park to include a certain

amount of community open space, or more than one type of recreation area or facility; and

WHEREAS, because of the number of children residing in Districts 1 through 4, it is likely that children live at mobile home parks that will benefit from playgrounds, community open space, and other recreation areas or facilities; NOW, THEREFORE,

## BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN:

The Council initiates amendments to City Code Chapter 25-2 (*Zoning*) that will do the following:

- require a new mobile home park to include a playground and at least one other type of recreation facility or area;
- require a new mobile home park to provide community open space that can be used for community gardens or other open space activities;
- require an existing mobile home park owner or licensee to provide areas where park residents can grow fruit and vegetables; and
- limit the ability of a mobile home park owner or licensee to charge a fee for residents to use the playground, recreation facility or area.

The Council directs the City Manager, to the extent feasible, to process the amendments described in this Resolution.
