The Austin Transportation Department (ATD) is developing a new component to its Employee Commute Trip						

The Austin Transportation Department (ATD) is developing a new component to its Employee Commute Trip Reduction Program called Healthy Commute that aims to help employees take alternative transportation commutes regularly (transit, carpool, vanpool, bike, walk, telework). Healthy Commute will build upon the commitments made in the regional Ozone Advance Program Action Plan by further reducing environmental emissions from motor vehicles. Additionally, the program is expected to help improve employee health, reduce traffic congestion, and increase parking availability at City buildings.

ATD is seeking approval to accept grant funding from CAPCOG's Regional Air Quality Grant to purchase a multimodal tracking tool that will complement the Healthy Commute effort. The efficient collection of timely and reliable commute data from employees is essential to the success of the City's Employee Commute Trip Reduction Program. It is expected that emission reductions will be calculated based on data entered into and reported through the multimodal tracking tool.

The General Fund will not be required to contribute additional funds beyond those currently budgeted to this grant. When the grant funds expire, the Austin Transportation Department's need for continuing funding will be evaluated and may be denied.
