PROPOSAL

Partial demolition of a ca. 1899 house that was moved to the current site in 1948, for the construction of a second-story addition.

ARCHITECTURE

One-story, rectangular-plan, side-gabled frame house with a symmetrical composition; small, front'gabled independent entry hood on turned wood posts; single 2:2 fenestration.

RESEARCH

The house appears to have been built around 1899 by Jacob and Virginia Bailetti Fattore, who lived here for the rest of their lives with their 3 daughters and a nephew. Jacob Bailetti was born in Austria, and came to the United States in the 1870s. He appears in the Austin city directories in the 1880s as a grocery merchant. His wife, Virginia Bailetti Fattore, was the daughter of a prominent Italian-American family in Austin, who was in the grocery business. Jacob and Virginia had 3 daughters, none of whom married. The girls worked in various retail businesses, including millinery and dry goods. In addition, Emil Fattore, who is listed as a nephew in census reports, lived with the family. He was also in the grocery business, and had a saloon as well. The Fattore family had their businesses at 3rd and Nueces Streets.

This house was originally at 511 W. 4th Street, and was moved to its current location in 1948, by Payne & Wiley, a local real estate firm. Virginia Fattore passed away in 1945, and her daughters moved to a house on W. 13th Street – away from the increasingly industrial nature, which included the adjacent Walker's Aus-Tex Chili factory, of the W. 4th Street location. After the house was moved, it served as a rental property.

STAFF COMMENTS


The house is beyond the bounds of any City survey to date.


STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Staff initially pulled this case for discussion because of the proposed second story addition on the front of the house and the change in the roofline, modifying the historic appearance and configuration of this ca. 1899 house. The applicants have agreed to modify their design for the addition to modify their design to better respect and articulate the existing house, and staff cannot in good conscience recommend historic landmark designation for this house. The house has suffered some obvious and suspected alterations, including the front porch, and a possible change from a hipped to a side-gabled roof at the time it was moved in 1948. In the absence of a very strong case for historic designation, staff must recommend release of the permit upon completion of a City of Austin Documentation Package, consisting of photographs of all elevations, a dimensioned sketch plan, and a narrative history, for archiving at the Austin History Center.

BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES:

Jacob and Virginia Fattore (ca. 1899 – ca. 1945)

The 1900 U.S. Census shows Jacob and Virginia Fattore at 504 W. 4th Street, the old address for this house. The census report indicates that the family owned the house. Jacob Fattore was 54, had been born in Austria, and was a grocer. He had immigrated to the United States in 1872. Virginia Fattore was 58, had been born in Italy, and had no occupation listed. She had immigrated to the United States in 1874. They had 3 daughters listed with them: Rosa, 18; Amelia, 14; and Eva, 12, all of whom had been born in Texas..

J. Fattore appears in the 1910 U.S. Census at 505 W. 4th Street, a former address of this house, but it appears that "J. Fattore" refers to Virginia Fattore, who was a 50-year old Italian-born widow with her own income. With her lived her 3 daughters, Rose, 27; Amelia, 23; and Eva, 21, as well as her nephew, Emil Fattore, 32, a house carpenter. None of the girls had an occupation listed.

The 1920 U.S. Census shows Virginia Fattore at this house, when it was addressed as 511 W. 4th Street. She was a 59-year old Italian-born widow who had immigrated to the United States in 1879 and had become a naturalized citizen in 1905. She had no occupation listed. With her lived 3 daughters: Rosa, 38, who had no occupation shown; Emilia, 34, a saleslady in a department store; and Eva, 22, a saleslady in a department store. All the girls had been born in Texas. In addition, the household included Virginia's nephew, Emil Fattore, 40, who had been born in Italy and immigrated to the United States in 1905. He was a retail merchant, and a resident alien.

The 1930 U.S. Census shows Virginia Fattore as the owner of this house, located at 511 W. 4th Street. The house was worth \$3,500. Virginia Fattore was a 71-year old widow who is listed as retired. With her lived her 3 daughters, Rose, 48, who had no occupation listed ; Amelia, 44, a saleslady in a clothing store; and Eva, 42, a saleslady in a dry goods store, and her nephew, Emil Fattore, 49, a grocery merchant.

Her 1933 death certificate shows that Rose Fattore was living at 511 W. 4th Street at the time of her death. She had been born in 1881 in Austin, and was a single woman. She had no business listed on the certificate, which notes obesity as a contributing cause of her death.

The 1940 U.S. Census shows Virginia Fattore as the owner of this house, which was worth \$5,000; the house is listed as 511 W. 4th Street. She was an 81-year old widow with no occupation listed. With her lived her two surviving daughters: Amelia, 48, a business machine operator for the Tax Assessor's Office; and Eva, 46, who had no occupation listed, as well as her nephew, Emil, 62, a grocer.

Eva Fattore died on New Year's Eve, 1972. She was living at 600 W. 13th Street at the time of her death. She had been born in 1887 in Austin, and was a retired clerk in a clothing store.

Amelia Fattore's 1974 death certificate shows that she was born in 1885 in Milan, Italy. She was living at 6222 N. Lamar at the time of her death, and was a sales clerk in retail sales. Her mother's maiden name was Virginia Bailetti.


AMELIA FATTORE
