### **Austin Arts Commission Role**

- Funding Working Group Guiding Principles:
  - Consistent with the Application Guidelines
  - Consistent with and respecting the integrity of the panel process and score
  - Consistent with logic used in the past (previous matrix parameters)
  - Funding process/plan sound and defendable/explainable
- Arts Commission goal is to create a funding plan that:
  - Supports equitable distribution,
  - Reflects fiscal responsibility, and
  - Provides for a plan for the future



### What is the Matrix?

- Funding tool adopted by Council in August 2005
- Distributes funds equitably based on the scores from the panel process
- Categorizes all applicants according to size of budgets
- Establishes maximum funding amounts and % of operating budgets in each category:
  - Larger organizations receive larger awards, but lower percentage of overall budget
  - Smaller organizations receive smaller awards but are eligible for a greater percentage of their budget

### Proposed FY 17 Matrix Parameters

#### Score

- All Applications were scored on a curve
- Increased the ceiling award amount
- Decreased percent of budget
  - Percent of budget is based on an average of FY13 & FY14 Operating Budgets
  - Project Support I, II & III applicants have a 25% in-kind modifier
  - Additional 10% AALANA (African American, Latino, Asian, Native American) modifier
- Increased per point deduction
- Maintained minimum award amount of \$1,000
- Additional contractual requirement for applicants to notify the Arts Commission of their events.



### **AALANA Modifier**

- AALANA = African American, Latino, Asian, Native American
- The 10% modifier was applied to AALANA applicants' 2-year budget average
- Preserves the integrity of the process by adding it to the two year budget average
- Adds an additional \$77,943 over the 74 awarded AALANA applicants

CREATIVE INDUSTRY PROGRAM

#### **City of Austin Economic Development Department**

The Cultural Arts Division (CAD) supports the economic development, community development, and revitalization of the City by strengthening and promoting arts, culture, and creative industries for purposes of attraction and retention of businesses, preserving quality of life for residents, and cultivating tourism.

- The Art in Public Places Program (AIPP) commissions artworks, ranging from murals and sculptures to functional architectural elements, for new and remodeled public facilities.
   By City ordinance, 2% of all eligible capital improvement project budgets are allocated to commission or purchase public art for that site.
- The TEMPO program allows artists to propose and create temporary public artworks in a range of themes suitable for the outdoor environment. It provides the opportunity for innovative, thought-provoking artwork that impacts the way people experience their environment, and invites dialogue and interaction with others.
- The CreateAustin Cultural Master Plan is a set of action-based strategies to be implemented
  in partnership with the community to sustain the city as a magnet for arts, culture, and
  creativity. These strategies are also integrated into the Imagine Austin
  comprehensive plan and implemented through the Creative Economy Priority Program.
- The **Civic Arts** program conducts economic impact studies, reports, research projects, and long-range planning initiatives such as mixed-use regeneration projects, cultural asset mapping, and creative space development.
- **Creative Industries Development** assistance is provided to filmmakers, gaming companies, and other for-profit creative industry professionals.
- Creative Content Incentive Program offers incentives to qualifying film, television, video game, and visual effects projects.
- The Media Production and Development Zone incentive, nominated by the City of Austin
  and administered by the Texas Film Commission, is a two-year exemption on sales and use
  taxes charged on select equipping of a media production facility.
- Austin's United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO)
   Designation as the only new 'City of Media Arts' will strengthen opportunities for joint creative industry development within the UNESCO Creative Cities Network.

- The Core Funding Programs offer organizational and project support to local 501c3 arts and culture organizations, as well as qualifying individual artists and organizations.
- The Community Initiatives Program offers funding to support the marketing, production, and
  presentation of public performances and exhibitions by nonprofits arts and culture organizations, as well
  as qualifying individual artists and organizations.

#### CULTURAL FUNDING PROGRAMS

- The Cultural Expansion Program provides funding to strengthen the marketing and audience development capacity of arts organizations serving primarily minority or traditionally underserved audiences.
- The Cultural Heritage Festivals Program provides funding to local 501c3 nonprofit
  organizations to strengthen the marketing, production, presentation, and funding of a culturally-specific
  festival.
- The Capacity Building Program provides funding to local or State of Texas 501c nonprofit arts
  organizations located in Austin to support organizational infrastructure, in areas including, but not limited
  to, management, governance, financial resources, and
  administrative systems.
- The Culture Alive Program provides funding for artistic expressions and traditions practiced within diverse ALAANA (African, Latino, Asian, Arab and Native American) communities and/or cultural groups, to achieve greater cultural equity in Austin.
- The People's Gallery showcases the work of Austin-area visual artists in a year-long exhibition at City Hall.

#### PUBLIC PROGRAMS & OUTREACH

- Art After Six are free community arts events to promote public understanding and enjoyment of art and includes artist talks, special guest lectures, workshops or tours of City artworks.
- Austin's New Year (ANY) is an annual free event on Vic Mathias Shores where Austin
  families can come together to welcome in the New Year and celebrate Austin's diverse
  creative community through art, films, and music.
- The City of Austin Public Service Employee Memorial honors civil and non-civil employees who lost their lives in the line of duty.
- The **City of Austin Artwork Donation and Loan Policy** allows the community to propose privately funded artworks for consideration of City acquisition.
- Monthly Cultural Arts Division newsletters, a quarterly CreateAustin newsletter, and other e-mail communications keep the community informed of CAD activities and arts & culture news.

### PARTNERSHIP PROGRAMS

- Artist-in-Residence Program embeds artists within City departments to develop imaginative
  approaches for community engagement and creative expression, and so they may engage civically.
- **Creative Learning Initiative** is a partnership among the City of Austin, Austin Independent School District, MINDPOP and over 40 arts and cultural organizations dedicated to student success through an arts-rich education.


