On January 23, 2017 we asked the City of Austin Historic Landmark Commission to allow us to move a Stone Shed to twenty feet to the west of its current location as well as to remove the Historic Zoning from the rear of the property.

The Historic Lanmark Commission ask if the Texas Historic Commission has jurisdiction over the Shed and the land affected by the zoning change as well as to consider the Archaeology.

Please find attached E-mail from Elizabeth Brummett with THC. She says that the RTHL does not cover the Stone Shed or the land. Only the Exterior of the Stanley House.
So no, the THC does not have jurisdiction over the Stone Shed or the land.

As far as the Archaeology goes we have contacted Bob Ward with the Travis County Historic Society. Bob Ward and Leslie Bush have coordinated Archaeologist to help with the excavation of the foundation at the proposed Stone Shed location as well as the area of the existing foundation.
