AARC Strategic Plan Background

Summer/Fall 2016, we hired Consultant Meeta Kothare (Neeva Solutions) to facilitate the AARC City facility strategic planning process.

Purpose: Develop a five-year Strategic Plan for Phase 1 • Address systematic growth in keeping with our Mission • Reflect upon changing needs of AAPI community.

Stakeholders: Museums and Cultural Programs Division Manager; AARC City Facility Staff; AAQOL Advisory Commission (AARC Working Group); AARC Nonprofit; Network of Asian American Organizations (NAAO); and the General Public.

Process: Consultant Interviews; Staff Surveys; Consultant Retreat (September 23, 2016); and Community Engagement Forum (November 10, 2016).

AARC Vision and Mission

Vision: Empower Austin's diverse communities through cultural understanding and life-enhancing opportunities.

Mission: Provide spaces, services, programs and resources through an Asian American Pacific Islander (AAPI) perspective.

AARC Strategic Plan Development

City staff and stakeholder feedback gathered and organized by the Consultant Goals prioritized with public input at the Community Engagement Forum







Goal I

Achieve a balance of program offerings that are reflective of the AAPI community needs.

- Adapt to changing demographics (ex: RICE Program)
- Expand youth programs (ex: After School)
- Increase programs and services for refugees and new immigrants



Goal II

Ensure AAPI community and general public are well-informed about the AARC City Facility.

- Evaluate, modify and create communication tools/mechanisms
- Increase frequency and quality of community engagement activities (ex: video presentation)
- Build relationships with schools and organizations that serve refugees and new immigrant familes

Goal III (tied)

Seek active partnerships.

- Define partnerships:
 - 1. Interlocal Agreements
 - 2. Co-sponsorships
 - 3. Collaborations
- Ensure partnerships are mission-focused and relevant
- Diversify partnerships (ex: programs, services, special events, etc.)
- Make efficient use of AARC facility resources













Goal III (tied)

Provide improved and safer access to the facility.

- Pedestrian Bridge to Rutherford Lane Campus
- Public Transportation
 Options (MetroAccess)
- Reconstruct Cameron Road median for vehicles turning in/out of the facility
- Repair sidewalks along Cameron Road
- Expand street and building lighting







Goal IV

Ensure facility features and amenities are consistent with program and organization goals.

- Ballroom partitions (8 sections)
- Children's playscape
- Outdoor exercise and recreational equipment
- Outdoor picnic tables
- More signage
- Address limited office and storage space







Community Engagement Results

Primary Feedback and/or Requests:

- Increased Parking
- More Asian Language and Conversational English Classes
- Adult Counseling/Mental Health Services and Anti-Bullying Prevention for Youth
- Increased Evening Activities (theater, karaoke, guest speakers, foreign films)

Secondary Feedback and/or Requests:

- More Volunteer Opportunities
- Gardening and other Outdoor Activities
- Citizenship Classes
- Culinary Classes
- Computer and Technology Classes
- Language Interpretation Services and Translated Documents

Additional Consultant Recommendations

- Plan for Succession
- Focus on the Mission
- Establish Success Metrics (timelines/milestones)
- Be Flexible
- Continue to clarify relationship between AARC City facility and AARC Nonprofit
- Use a Collective-impact Model amongst AAPI organizations

Conclusion

Strategic planning process has provided clear and comprehensive direction for moving forward while uniting our team of City staff and stakeholders.

- Limited Space
- Limited Personnel
- Limited Funding
