HISTORIC LANDMARK COMMISSION FEBRUARY 27, 2017 DEMOLITION AND RELOCATION PERMITS HDP-2016-0917 1409 E. 3RD STREET

PROPOSAL

Demolish a ca. 1936 house.

ARCHITECTURE

One-story, rectangular-plan, front-gabled stone-veneered house with a Cumberland-style configuration in its symmetrical façade and twin front doors; single and paired 1:1 fenestration; almost full-width, front-gabled independent porch on plain, square wood posts.

RESEARCH

The house appears to have been built around 1936, although there was a prior house on this site dating from around 1902. That was a frame house with a projecting front bay as shown on the 1935 Sanborn map, and was the home of Claiborne (Clabe) and George Hankins, who had grown up on this property at a house referenced in directories and the 1900 Sanborn map as 1407 E. 6th Street.

That earlier house appears to have been demolished around 1936 and the current house constructed at the same time. Bonifacio and Marcelina Espinosa were renting the frame house until Bonifacio passed away. In the city directories of the early 1930s, Marcelina Espinosa is shown as the renter of what is believed to have been the frame house, along with two daughters: Dora and Maggie. Between the directories of 1935 and 1937, Marcelina Espinosa goes from being listed as a renter to an owner. Although there are no building or utility permits to confirm this proposed date of construction for the existing house, it seems to conform to the shift in tenancy at the house. Further, the house next door, also a stone-veneer house, dates from 1938, although there was also an earlier frame house on that site as well. The 1935 Sanborn map shows frame houses on these sites; the 1962 Sanborn map shows both of these houses as having a stone veneer.

Marcelina Espinosa lived in this house from around 1936 until her death in 1971. She had no occupation listed in the city directories throughout most of her life, but in the mid-1960s, she worked for Kelly Smith Cleaners.

STAFF COMMENTS

The house is listed in the East Austin Historic Survey (2016) as minimal traditional in style, and dating from 1945. The survey notes that the porch has been altered, and the doors, windows, and roofing materials have been replaced. The survey recommends that this house would be contributing to a local or National Register historic district, but is not individually eligible.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Strongly encourage rehabilitation and adaptive re-use, as the house would be contributing to a potential historic district in the neighborhood, and is one of several stone-veneered houses in the vicinity, including the house next door, but staff does not believe that the house qualifies individually as a historic landmark. If the Commission votes to release the permit, then staff recommends completion of a City of Austin Documentation Package, consisting of photographs of all elevations, a dimensioned sketch plan, and a narrative history, for archiving at the Austin History Center.

I want to first say it was good to have the opportunity to speak with you again in person regarding my permit and project in general. I appreciate you taking the time to discuss my thoughts on the project and appreciate your insight and input.

I have considered and discussed the stone currently on the home for use with the new structure, with everyone close to me or involved in the project. While I still have every intention of reusing the materials, I can't get it to fit the vision I have for the actual stone veneer. Honestly, if the stone was sawn top and bottom I would be hard pressed not to use it, but my vision is 12" tall stone on courses. A more monolithic look that gives the stone portions of the exterior veneer a more substantive permanent feel.

I would like to have the community feel for themselves that I am a local person respecting the communities history, but I don't think this particular issue will be the way I find common ground. My hope is that the design stands out from the rest of the homes built and that my attention to detail in the design, as well as how we handle the construction process itself, show through.

NOTE: Prior directory listings show Marcelina Espinosa (and before that, Bonifacio and Marcelina Espinoza) as the renters of an earlier frame house on this site that could date back as early as 1902. However, it is believed that the existing house was built around 1936. Earlier directories show that Bonifacio and Marcelina Espinoza lived at this site in a rental house from around 1923 until around 1936, when it is believed that Marcelina built the current house. City directories further show that the site was occupied by Claiborne (Clabe) and George Hankins and their families from around 1902 until around 1920. Clabe and George Hankins were African-Americans who had a variety of jobs, including working as a carpenter, porter, servant, expressman, and yardman.


BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES:

Marcelina Espinosa (ca. 1936 – ca. 1971)


The 1930 U.S. Census shows Marcelina Espinosa as the owner of perhaps the former house on this site, which was worth \$700. She was a 40-year old Texas-born widow who was a laundress at home. Both her parents had been born in Mexico. She had 5 children: Julian, 19, a laborer; Manuel, 16, a laborer; Nora, 15, who did housework for a family; Maggie, 12; and Katie, 10. All of the children had been born in Texas.

Her 1971 death certificate shows that Marcelina Espinoza was born in January, 1885 in Texas, and was living at this house at the time of her death. She was a homemaker.


