PROPOSAL

Demolish a ca. 1949 house.

ARCHITECTURE

One-story, wing-and-gable plan frame house with a partial-width, shed-roofed independent porch; single and paired 1:1 fenestration; attached one-bay garage.

RESEARCH

The house was built in 1949 by Mrs. Barney Slaughter as an investment property. The first occupant of the house was a widow, Mrs. Olive (Ollie) Swenson, who lived here until around 1951. Olive Swenson had been a widow since 1933; her husband was a cotton farmer in rural Travis County. According to the 1940 U.S. Census report, Olive Swenson was renting a farm in rural Travis County with her 7 children, the oldest of whom were all farm laborers. Prior to renting this house, she had lived on Garner Avenue in South Austin.

The house remained a rental property through the early 1960s, when it was purchased by James C. and Margaret L. Burleson, who lived here for the rest of their lives. James C. Burleson was retired while he and Margaret lived in this house; he died in 1974. Margaret Burleson worked as a secretary; she died in 1978. Since that time, the house has been either a rental property or home to short-term owners.

STAFF COMMENTS

The house is beyond the bounds of any City survey to date.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Encourage rehabilitation and adaptive re-use, then relocation over demolition if the house is structurally stable enough to do so, but release the permit upon completion of a City of Austin Documentation Package, consisting of photographs of all elevations, a dimensioned sketch plan, and a narrative history, for archiving at the Austin History Center. The house has neither the architectural nor the historical significance to warrant individual designation as a historic landmark.

BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES

Olive Swenson (ca. 1949 – ca. 1951)

The 1930 U.S. Census shows Tom and Olive Swenson as the renters of a farm in Precinct 2 of Travis County. Tom Swenson was 49, had been born in Texas to Swedish-born parents, and was a cotton farmer. Olive Swenson was 38, had been born in Texas to Iowa-born parents, and had no occupation listed. They had 7 children: Charlie, 20, a farm laborer; Peter, 18; Emma, 16; Bertha, 10; Edward, 7; Dan Moody, 3; and Thomas, 2 months. All of the children had been born in Texas. In addition, Tom's brother, Charles H. Swenson, 57, is listed as a member of the household; he was born "at sea," and was a cotton farmer

The 1940 U.S. Census shows Olive Swenson as the renter of a farm in Precinct 2 of Travis County. She was a 51-year old Texas-born widow who was a farmer. With her lived her 7 children: Will, 32, a farm laborer; Pete, 27, a farm laborer; Bertha, 20; Edward, 17; Dan, 13; Thomas, 11; and Emma Gattis, 26. Also in the household was Emma's son, Will Max Gattis, 5. There is no listing for Emma's husband in the census report.

Tom Swenson was born in 1879 in Manor, Texas, and was a farmer. He died in 1933. Her 1965 death certificate shows that Olive Swenson was born in San Antonio in July, 1889, and was living at 4806 Duval Street at the time of her death. She was a widowed housewife.

Mrs. Olive Swenson, 6222 North Lamar Boulevard, died in a local hospital Tuesday.

She is survived by two daughters, Miss Bertha Swenson, Fort Worth, and Mrs. Robert Hohertz, Austin; four sons, Tommy Swenson, Bill Swenson and Dan Swenson, Austin, and Ed Swenson, Milano; two brothers, Henry Roberts, San Antonio, and George Roberts, Fort Worth; and ten grandchildren.

Funeral will be Wednesday at 2 p.m. at Cook Funeral Home with Rev. W. E. Dickerson officiating, Burial will be in Austin Memorial Park.

Pallbearers will be Emmett Walton, Andrew-Anderson, Paul Hohertz, Leon Anderson, Jerry Anderson and Allen Samuels.
