HISTORIC LANDMARK COMMISSION FEBRUARY 27, 2017 DEMOLITION AND RELOCATION PERMITS HDP-2017-0026 1401 WALNUT AVENUE

PROPOSAL

Demolish a ca. 1925 house.

ARCHITECTURE

One-story, clipped front-gabled frame bungalow with a partial-width clipped front-gabled partially inset porch on ornamental metal posts; single and paired 1:1 and 6:6 fenestration.

RESEARCH

The house appears to have been built around 1925. The first owners and occupants were Thomas J. and Odessa Moore, who lived here for the rest of their lives; Odessa Moore died in 1984. Thomas Moore was a long-time maintenance employee of the University of Texas, who had previously worked as a truck driver for a transfer company (according to the 1930 U.S. Census report). Odessa Moore did not have any occupation listed in city directories, but the 1930 U.S. Census report shows that she was a laundress for a private family.

STAFF COMMENTS


The East Austin Historic Resources Survey (2016) states that the house has had the exterior wall materials, windows, and doors have been replaced and the porch has been altered; the house is therefore not eligible for individual or district designation.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Encourage rehabilitation and adaptive re-use, then relocation over demolition, but release the permit upon completion of a City of Austin Documentation Package, consisting of photographs of all elevations, a dimensioned sketch plan, and a narrative history, for archiving at the Austin History Center. The house has neither the architectural nor the historical significance to warrant individual designation as a historic landmark, but staff disagrees with the survey recommendation regarding its inclusion within a potential historic district, as the house represents the scale, history, and context of this neighborhood.

BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES:

Thomas J. and Odessa Moore (ca. 1925 – ca. 1984)

The 1940 U.S. Census shows Tom J. and Odessa Moore as the owners of this house, which was worth \$900. Tom J. Moore was 40, had been born in Texas, and was a shop man for the university. Odessa Moore was 40, had been born in Texas, and had no occupation listed. They had 3 children: Tom J.,, Jr., 16; Dorothy, 15; and Bobby Ella, 5. All of the children had been born in Texas and none had an occupation shown.

The 1930 U.S. Census shows Tom J. and Odessa Moore as the owners of this house, which has its former address of 1402 Walnut Avenue. The house was worth \$1,000. Tom J. Moore was 31, had been born in Texas, and was a truck driver for a transfer company. Odessa Moore was 30, had been born in Texas, and was a laundress for a private family. They had 3 children: Myrtle, 8; Tom, Jr., 6; and Dorothy, 6 months. All of the children had been born in Texas.

His 1968 death certificate shows that Thomas J. Moore was living at this address at the time of his death. He was born in 1899 in Travis County, and was a married maintenance man. Odessa Moore was his wife.
