The current social service agreement with Caritas of Austin was awarded through the 2014 Austin Public Health Self- Sufficiency Request for Applications with services beginning on September 1, 2015 for an initial 37-month term						
ending on September 30, 2018 in the amount of \$9,992,721, with three 12-month extension options in the amount of						
\$3,330,907 per extension option. Amendment No. 1 included a six percent increase of \$599,562, and Amendment						
No. 2 included additional one-time funding of \$65,000 for flood disaster financial assistance activities.						
During the Fiscal Year 2016-2017 budget process, Council approved \$600,000 in funding for current social service						
providers for a cost of living increase which resulted in a 2.3% increase for most social service contracts.						

Amendment No. 3 will increase the contract by \$162,416 with each extension option \$3,611,969 for total contract amount for the period September 1, 2015 through September 30, 2018 of \$10,819,699.

Caritas of Austin administers the Best Single Source Plus Collaborative (BSS+C) program, consisting of 13 partner agencies. The BSS+C program provides individuals and families in Austin/Travis County with comprehensive housing stability resources inclusive of case management and basic needs services.

This program ensures that clients have access to basic necessities, starting with housing and extending to food, clothing, physical/mental health care, and other supportive services.
