1. INTRODUCTIONS

2. CITIZEN COMMUNICATION

• Laura Carbonneau: Described a citizen-led effort to develop and build beginner-friendly mountain bike trails near central Austin, with support from the Austin Ridge Riders Mountain Bike Club and Boneshaker organizations. 4. ITEMS FROM BAC

A. Design and Placement of Bike Racks – Briefing

Jesse Duncan, Street Designer with the Active Transportation and Street Design Division of the Austin Transportation Department (ATD), briefed the BAC on ATD's role in relation to bike parking in the city. The department receives requests for bike parking and installs U-racks and bike corrals in the city's right-of-way (ROW) where feasible. The department also provides technical consultation on best practices for bike parking effectiveness during the development review process. Mr. Duncan described some of the current off-street parking requirements for bicycles in the City Code, as well as potential improvements to end-of-trip facility requirements being explored through the CodeNEXT process.

Citizens, businesses and governmental entities can submit requests for bike parking through <u>3-1-1</u> or through emailing <u>bicycleprogram@austintexas.gov</u>. See the Active Transportation and Street Design Division's <u>Bicycle webpage</u> for more information.
