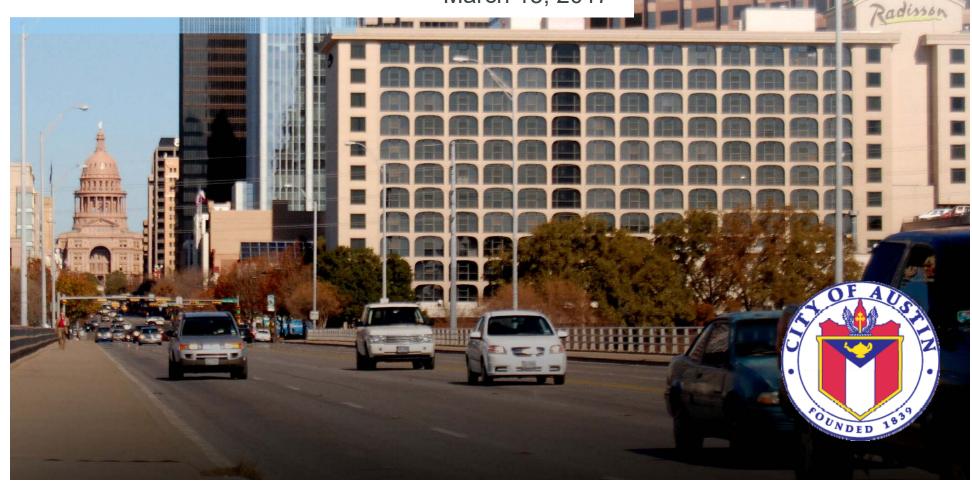

2012 Prop 12 G.O. Bond Overview

- 2012 Bond Program: \$306.6M
 - 2012 Prop 12 Transportation & Mobility: \$143.3M
 - >ATD's Portion: \$33.5M + Active Transportation (\$0.9M)
 - > \$20.8M Spent/Obligated to Date (62%) + \$0.4M Active Transportation
 - > \$12.7M Remaining to Spend (38%) + \$0.5M Active Transportation

ATD 2012 Prop 12 G.O. Bond Overview

5-year Spending Plan

- Prop 12 \$33.5M through FY 2018
- Regional/Corridor Mobility Improvements
- Arterial Congestion and Crash Risk Mitigation



FY 2017-18 Spending Plan - \$8.8M

- Arterial Congestion and Crash Risk Mitigation \$6.0M
 - Traffic Signal Modifications and Upgrades
 - Arterial Signalization and Roadway Improvements
- Regional/Corridor Improvements \$1.2M
 - IH-35 Corridor Improvements
 - East 51st Street Corridor Improvements

Austin Transportation Department

Featured Project: Local Area Traffic Management Program

Project Scope

> To design and construct improvements to mitigate adverse levels of speeding in Austin neighborhoods

CIP Funding

> \$3.5M under 2012 Prop 12

Spending Plan

> FY 18: \$0.3M

> FY 19 - FY 22: \$1.6M





Austin Transportation Department

Featured Project: Arterial Congestion & Crash Risk Mitigation

Project Scope

New Traffic Signals, Pedestrian Hybrid Beacons (PHB), Operational Improvements, and upgrading the Advanced Transportation Management System (ATMS)

CIP Funding

> \$6.5M under 2012 Prop 12

Spending Plan

> FY 18: \$1.2M

> FY 19: \$337K







Austin Transportation Department

Active Transportation

Project Scope

- Help everyone walk and bike around Austin safely, comfortably, and conveniently
- Existing project commitments, B-Cycle system expansion (docking stations), and construction opportunities coordinated with street resurfacing

CIP Funding

- > \$927k under 2012 Prop 12
 - > \$379k obligated (41%)
 - > \$548k left to spend (59%) + \$2.4M of matching TxDOT TAP Grant funds (Pedestrian Safety Citywide Project)

Spending Plan

> FY 17 - FY 18: \$548k + \$2.4M of matching grant funds



Regional Partnership Projects

Featured Project: IH-35 Corridor Development Program

Project Scope

Improve safety and mobility for all roadway users both along and across the IH-35 corridor



> \$15.0M under 2012 Prop 12

Spending Plan

> FY 18: \$0.5M





Regional Partnership Projects

Featured Project: MoPac Improvements (Pressler Extension)

Project Scope

Provide context-sensitive connection between Cesar Chavez and W. 5th/W. 6th streets serving all roadway users and Lamar Beach Park

CIP Funding

- > \$3.0M under 2012 Prop 12
- Easement secured from Parks and Recreation Department

Spending Plan

- Project on hold indefinitely
- Seeking reallocation of funds to other projects (E. 51st Street)

Corridor Mobility Development Program

Featured Project: E. 51st Street Corridor Improvements

Project Scope

> To design and construct improvements along East 51st Street between IH-35 and Old Manor Road where the street provides frontage for both the Mueller and Windsor Park neighborhoods

CIP Funding

> \$3.5M under 2012 Prop 12 + \$720k from Catellus

Spending Plan

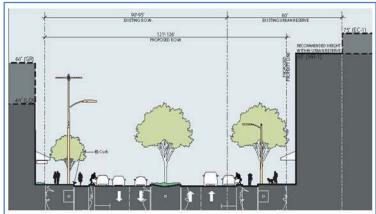
> FY 18: \$95k

> FY 19:\$2.7M

Approximately \$4M needed to fully fund construction

> Possible recipient of funds from Pressler **Extension Project**







Corridor Mobility Development Program

Featured Project: Riverside Drive at Lakeshore Improvements

Project Scope

> To design and construct improvements to Riverside Drive at Lakeshore Drive

CIP Funding

> \$1.2M under 2012 Prop 12

Spending Plan

- > Substantially complete
- > \$150k anticipated to be remaining after project closeout





ATD 2012 Prop 12: Remaining Balance

- Continue planned investments thru FY 2019
- Reallocate unutilized funding to Prop 12 projects in need
