### 1. APPROVAL OF MINUTES.

### (February 10, 2017)

- A. Approval of the MCPD November 15, 2016 Meeting Minutes and The Commission on Seniors February 10, 2016 Meeting Minutes.
  - i. Commissioner Orlowski mentioned the policy report listed under minutes should be moved to announcements
  - ii. Commissioner Kevin Jackson motioned to pass the minutes with the edit suggested by Commissioner Orlowski
  - iii. Commissioner Trejo seconded the motion
  - iv. Minutes were approved as amended on a 7-0 vote

### 2. CITIZEN COMMUNICATION

Cathy Cranston with ADAPT of Texas announced a rally and legislative briefing to be held at the Capitol on March 8th

### 4. NEW BUSINESS

A. Briefing and discussion regarding the Connections 2025 Draft Transit Plan (Lawrence Deeter, Senior Planner, Capital Metro)

- Connections 2025 included a yearlong study that:
  - Engaged the public
  - Completed market analysis
  - Completed service evaluation
  - Developed plan framework and guiding principles
  - Presented draft plan
  - Revised the plan
- Feedback on plan:
  - Frequency has been the highest priority based on Connections 2025 outreach
  - o Other key priorities include coverage, reliability, and speed
- Plan design principles:
  - Easy to understand network
  - Stronger frequent network
  - Match service to markets
  - o Concentrate on key customer experience attributes
  - Complement emerging mobility initiatives
  - Grow ridership and productivity

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- o Lay the groundwork for the future
- Coordinate land use, housing, infrastructure
- Service options include a mobility toolbox:
  - Rapid transit
  - o MetroRapid
  - o Frequent Local
  - o Local
  - o Community
  - o Express
- Current proposal:
  - Focuses on growing ridership and improving service performance
  - Expands frequent network
    - 4 MetroRapid Routes
    - 13 frequent local routes
    - Frequent service on core MetroRail route
  - o Minimizes impact on existing riders
    - 98.7% of existing riders within <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> mile of service
  - Responds to original plan concerns
- Frequent network
  - More frequent network corridors in the service area
  - Frequent corridors form key network spines
  - Less route duplication savings reinvested into creating more frequent service
- Frequent network benefits
  - Proposed frequent network can be accessed by 4 out of 5 current riders
  - $\circ$  Over  $\frac{1}{2}$  of all service-area residents and employees
  - Investment in 17 routes will make a major impact on 82% of today's riders
- Draft plan summary
  - Creates more useful, convenient mobility options for community
  - o An additional 200,000 people will have access to frequent transit
  - Applies a proven recipe for success
- ADA impacts
  - Capital Metro policy: Provide complimentary paratransit service with <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> mile of fixed route
  - o Restructuring of fixed routes will impact MetroAccess service area
  - o Overall impacts will be determined after board work session on February 17th
  - Capital Metro policy: MetroAccess provides a 90-day transition period for clients losing access to service

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- Next Steps:
  - February 17<sup>th</sup> Board of Directors Work Session
  - February 27<sup>th</sup> Anticipated Board Approval
- Information about plan available at <u>www.connections2025.org</u>
- Commissioner discussion on the presentation:
  - Comments regarding the difficulties with the process when using transfer options and discussion about how to have more direct routes
  - Comments regarding need to find savings where possible to help offset large financial need for additional infrastructure
  - Question regarding solutions for impact of change to route 19
    - Proposed routes that will generate ridership in associated areas including Far West, Balcones, and 38<sup>th</sup> Street
      - Could include increased frequence
  - Proposed mobility innovation zones part of the proposed plan
    - If passed, zones would be developed with community
  - Concerns about potential impact to MetroAccess, and question regarding anticipated scale of change
    - Approximately 66 trips a day would be impacted
- Citizen Communication: John Woodley would like for Capital Metro and the City of Austin to pay for moving expenses for people with disabilities if the rules related to distance from routes change

B. Discussion regarding developing recommendations for the Fiscal Year 2017-18 City of Austin budget

C. Commission on Senior Working Group Reports and updates:

- i. Commission Work Plan
  - Chair provided context for approach to developing plan including discussion of the Age Friendly Plan being utilized as a basis for the working group structure
    - Looking for areas of opportunity for collaboration with the Mayor's Committee for People with Disabilities

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#### ii. Transportation

- Discussion regarding March 4<sup>th</sup> transportation community meeting at the Bob Bullock Museum
- Commissioner Kareithi serves as Chair of the Transportation Working Group and will reach out to members of the Mayor's Committee for People with Disabilities to gauge interest in participation
  - Looking to begin broader discussion and look at previous recommendations approved by Council
- iii. Housing, Outdoor Spaces and Buildings
  - Vice Chair Varteressian discussed the focus on affordable housing in place and intergenerational living opportunities for folks as they age
  - Information gathering mode currently
    - Talking with staff and developers of individual projects to learn and provide input
  - Studying ADA audit and Parks and Recreation Strategic Master Planning process to identify opportunities for recommendations
- iv. Social Participation, Respect and Social Inclusion
  - Commissioner Garcia-Pittman distributed working document of the working group
    - Focus on Domain 4 in the Age Friendly Plan related to Social Participation
      - Looking to identify resources to build map for members of the community
    - Domain 5 relates to respect and social inclusion
      - Working group looking to engage and empower older adults
    - Group meets monthly and welcomes any members of the MCPD that would be interested in participating
- v. Civic Participation and Employment; Communication and Information
  - Still in fact finding stage, and welcome participation from any members of the MCPD
- vi. Community Health Services
  - Commissioner Pruett spoke about short and long term issues
  - Gave example of looking at how customer service for seniors is handled by department, and potential opportunities to improve training for City employees
    - o Looking for low-hanging fruit to make impact for seniors
  - Long term efforts to look at working with St. David's Foundation to consider mobile dental clinic for seniors
  - Working group is trying to meet on a monthly basis

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vii. Age Friendly City

- Meeting approximately every two months
- Coordinating with working groups for things that need to be tracked to ensure success of the plan
- General comments regarding plan and working groups:
  - Interest from MCPD to have disability issues added into each working group even if members are not able to attend
    - Everyone has a busy schedule, and that level of coordination could help with efforts
    - Discussion regarding previous debate about combining both Commissions, and then keeping separate to ensure that seniors and the disabled community have dedicated advocates
  - Discussion regarding whether joint meetings between Committees is still beneficial to continue
    - Majority of members expressed interest in continuing joint meetings
    - Acknowledgement of ordinance requirement of joint meetings annually
      - Would require Council action to remove this requirement
  - Discussion of sharing minutes of meetings between each Committee as well as Working Group documents to help encourage collaboration between the Commission on Seniors and the MCPD

D. Mayor's Committee on People with Disabilities: Update on MCPD Committees' meeting schedule, committee appointments, and related committees' activities.

- Access and Public Policy
  - Commissioner Saenz spoke to previous presentation from ADAPT Texas regarding disability rights
    - Discussion regarding Medicaid and concerns about the Affordable Care Act
      - Community First Option relates to match which may discontinue if the Affordable Care Act is discontinued
- o Awards and Outreach Committee
  - No new reports
- Education and Employment
  - No new reports

  - Offer to collaborate as City has an office specific to delivering these trainings
