

Austin Police Department Sexual Assault Investigations


- Request from Public Safety Commission to conduct an analysis of APD's Sex Crimes Investigations
- Attempt to determine if there were gaps in investigations, and identification of areas for improvement
- Attempt to have more successful resolutions to Sex Crimes Investigations

- Data was examined from the first quarter of 2015 (Jan-Mar)
- Data was selected from this time period in order to have allowed the investigative, forensic and judicial process time to run its course

Sexual Assaults	First Quarter of 2015	
Number of potential Sexual Assaults in Austin based on NCVS estimate	348	National Crime Victimization Survey for 2015 indicates only 32.5% of rapes are reported to police. This is a national average, and no data is available on a local scale. The number provided is calculated using this stat.
Number of reported Sexual Assaults to APD	113	
Arrests	10	Please Note: Not all of these arrests were based on the alleged Sexual Assault.
Cleared Exceptionally- Prosecution Declined	26	This number reflects the cases in which the prosecutor's office declined to pursue charges against an identified suspect.
Cleared Exceptionally- Victim Refused to Cooperate	23	This number reflects the cases in which the victim did not wish to pursue charges against the identified suspect.









Sexual Assault Investigations Cleared Exceptionally – Prosecution Declined

- Cases Cleared by Arrest 10 cases
 - 4 cases Charge other than Sexual Assault filed
 - Case 5: still pending, per the District Attorney's office
 - Case 6: an additional warrant was issued after the defendant failed to appear in court, this case is also currently pending
 - Case 7: case was dismissed
 - Case 8: defendant received 3 years in the Texas Department of Corrections
 - Case 9: case is pending, awaiting DNA
 - Case 10: defendant took a plea deal and served 120 days in jail

- Reasons Why Sexual Assault Cases Often Do Not Result in Prosecution
 - Victims do not wish to pursue the investigation
 - Several cases are waiting for DNA Analysis
 - Large individual detective caseloads

Investigative Phase


Investigative Outcomes

Police couldn't locate

53%		victim/victim didn't follow up- (115/216)		
19%	Insufficient evidence- (40/216)			
14%	Victim did not want to prosecute- (30/216)			
3% Reports indicated victim lied/victim doubted- (7/216)				
2% Cases sent to juvenile court- (4/216)				
3% No reason given for closing- (7/216)				
9%	Cases referred to Grand Jury- (19/216)

- Original 243 Sexual Assault Kits tested for presence of DNA, and submitted to CODIS
- 70% "hit rate" on these cases (171 cases)
- Remaining 72 cases either did not have DNA present, had DNA but did not have a match in CODIS, or DNA sample was not sufficient for upload to CODIS

Begun Center for Violence Prevention Research and Education Sexual Assault Kit Pilot Research Project - 2016

- This hit rate is very high.
- Selection of cases for this study was based on their ability to prosecute, but the cases had been closed for various reasons.
- Cases which had previously been adjudicated, were outside the statute of limitations or the suspect was deceased were not included.

Begun Center for Violence Prevention Research and Education Sexual Assault Kit Pilot Research Project - 2016

- Once DNA analysis had been performed, 74% of the 243 cases were indicted (181 cases)
- 39% of the 243 cases resulted in a conviction (96 cases)
