Background



Austin Emergency Medical Services was created as a third service by Council action in 1976, 40 years of service to the community.

- Singular mission of Healthcare and a Practice of Medicine
- ► Inter-Local to provide transport service within Travis County in 2000 which then created the System of Austin Travis County EMS
- Citizens voted and approved Civil Service in 2012 for medics
- Accredited through Commission on Accreditation of Ambulances Services (CAAS) in 2013 and 2016
- The communications center has been Accredited Center of Excellence (ACE) since 2000 from the National Academy of Emergency Dispatch

Different models



- ► Third Service Separate EMS department
- High Performance model
- Public Utility model
- Hospital Based model
- ▶ Fire Based EMS Combined Fire/EMS department
- Outsourced EMS provider

Changes must consider...



- What are we trying to solve? (e.g., operational efficiency, fiscal impact, etc.)
- Labor issues, including
 - Contracts
 - Pensions
 - Wage equity
 - Cultural differences
- Evaluation of healthcare delivery to the public

Should Council desire to explore further, consider providing funding to engage an independent consultant



In the meantime...



- Continue Improvement Process effort to ensure right resource to the right patient in the right time
 - Alternative Transport Unit (ATU) pilot
 - Actively Developing New Revenue streams with payer groups
 - In May 2017, EMS launching another phase of modifications that will reduce Ambulance responses
 - Evaluate areas of duplication in AFD/EMS services, and work together to enhance areas of opportunity
- ► Future improvement cycles
 - Continue to modify which resources are sent to what calls as a system
 - Single Medic Response Units
 - Mobile Integrated Healthcare
 - Telemedicine
