Who We Are Housing & Community Development


Mission of the City of Austin's Neighborhood Housing and Community Development (NHCD):

To provide housing, community development and small business development services to benefit eligible residents, so they can have access to livable neighborhoods and increase their opportunities for self-sufficiency.

Objective of the Auditing and Monitoring Team at NHCD:

To design systems, controls, processes and procedures to both ensure the accuracy of and protect the investment decisions of council.

Who We Are Auditing and Monitoring Team



What We Do

Accounting

- Conduct accounting reconciliations, entries and financial reporting
- Prepare and review fiscal notes for RCA/RBA's

Audit

- Serve as Liaison for all audits
- Design and test internal/audit controls
- Conduct risk assessments and desk reviews
- Design and implement business processes and procedures

Finance

- Respond to Budget/Finance Deliverables
- Track and report performance measures, production
- Report on Federal Grants

Monitoring

- Oversee compliance of federal and local regulations
- Monitor subrecipient agencies, multi-family and single family projects
- Provide technical assistance and research for regulatory compliance

Types of Monitoring

- Subrecipient
 - Agencies providing grant funded services on behalf of NHCD
- Funded Multi-Family Projects
 - Projects receiving federal or local dollars
- Incentive Based Multi-Family Projects
 - Projects obtained through zoning or incentive action
- Single Family
 - Homebuyer and homeowner assistance programs for individuals

Subrecipient Monitoring

- 1. Scale/Population
 - 12 subrecipients funded through formula/HUD grants
 - Renter, Homeowner, Business and Public Service Assistance
- 2. Methodology/Approach
 - Annual risk assessment
 - Evaluate agency performance
 - Review contract files against HUD checklists
 - Conduct on-site review
 - Provide technical guidance

Funded Multi-Family Monitoring

- 1. Scale/Population
 - 78 development projects
 - 3,506 affordable units
- 2. Methodology/Approach
 - Annual risk assessment
 - Randomly select 10% of units during review
 - On-site monitoring by NHCD staff
 - Physical inspections performed by Blueprint Housing Solutions (3rd party)
 - Provide technical assistance

Incentive Based Multi-Family Monitoring

- 1. Scale/Population
 - 75 projects
 - 2,751 affordable units
- 2. Methodology/Approach
 - Annual risk assessment
 - Randomly select 10% of units during review
 - Rent/income certifications performed by Blueprint Housing Solutions
 - Provide technical guidance

Single Family Monitoring

- 1. Scale/Population
 - 1,454 loans outstanding
 - Down Payment Assistance, Homeowner Rehabilitation Loan Program
- 2. Methodology/Approach
 - Annual risk assessment
 - Review tax records, code compliance, TCAD, utility records, etc.
 - Manage release of liens, loan modifications, refinancing, etc.
 - Manage repayment process
 - Work with City Law Department
 - Provide technical guidance

Compliance & Monitoring Systems of Record

Affordable Housing Inventory (AHI)

- Affordable housing tracking & reporting
- System of record for multi-family monitoring
- Affordability compliance
- Performance measurement

Application Mgmt. and Data Automation (AMANDA)

- City's development review, permitting, and inspection system
- Project tracking
- Informs Affordable Housing Inventory

Nortridge Loan System (NLS)

- Loan servicing software
- System of record for single family monitoring
- Reconciled to AIMS accounting system and notes receivable




