Sor Juana Inés de la Cruz: A Tribute to Mexican Women

A multi-disciplinary event where Latino musicians, actors, dancers and visual artists showcase their works in honor of this exceptional Mexican nun from the 17th Century.

We recognize the importance of Mexico's independence day on September 16th, through a series of workshops, presentations and performances celebrating Mexican culture and traditions.

This event honors an indigenous Mexican holiday that celebrates the life cycle through altars built to commemorate the deceased and includes family art activities, altar exhibits, a classic car show, artist market, food vendors, and a costume contest.





EDUCATION

YOUTH PROGRAMS

Siembra: Spring Break Camp

In this bilingual program youth take a variety of culturally relevant arts and wellness classes which will plant the seeds of creativity, innovation, and critical thought.

Cosecha: Summer Break Camp

In this bilingual program youth will spend each 2-week session learning about Latinx culture, history, artists, and community builders while taking a variety of arts and wellness classes such as: Music, Visual Arts, Performance, Capoeira, and Puppetry!

TEEN PROGRAMS

Caminos Teen Leadership Program Caminos is the ESB-MACC's Teen Leadership program awarding paid internships and professional development opportunities for Teens to carve their own path in a creative career while exploring Latinx culture.

Extra Credit: Teen Volunteer Program

Extra Credit seeks to enrich the lives of all Teens through engaging volunteer opportunities working with Art Educators, Arts Production staff, and assisting with Arts Events.

ADULT PROGRAMS

Curanderismo: Indigenous Healing Workshops Reconnect with your roots as we explore the history and techniques of traditional healing arts with classes led by Marika Alvarado.

Tours of the Tejano Trails

Free walking tours of the Tejano Trails led by volunteer docents teach participants about the rich culture and history of East Austin.

Cine de Oro

Once a month, we present screenings of Mexican film classics exclusively for Ssenior citizens with free lunch provided by AARP

WELLNESS PROGRAMS

>> Nutrition & Tradition

Chefs demonstrates how to make variations of traditional Mexican recipes while keeping health in mind. This workshop series teaches healthier approaches to staples in the Mexican diet as well as connecting participants with their indigenous roots through the tradition cooking.

Participants will strengthen their physical, mental and emotional bodies through this bilingual offering of gentle heath yoga.

Community Healing Garden

Participants are invited to get their hands dirty as they dive into growing and cultivating traditional Mexican healing herbs. Volunteers that participate in workdays receive hands on experience and share in the harvest.

OUTREACH
