- Provides statistics for 2016 crashes








# Vision Zero Annual Report: Highlights




### **Evaluation: Vision Zero Input Tool**



### Policy: State Lege Update

- HB 1368 (lower prima facie to 25 mph) was introduced by Rep. Israel
- SB 2103 (lower speed to 20 mph if prima facie is deemed unreasonable or unsafe) was introduced by Garcia
- HB 1745 (allow 25 mph on a highway or street in city with pop. 130K +)
- HB 1677 (state Vision Zero task force) introduced by Israel
- HB 2068 (repeal driver responsibility program)


