In related items on the June 15, 2017, agenda, the City Council will consider approval of the South Congress Public Improvement District (PID) 2018 Service and Assessment Plan and Budget, setting the assessment rate for the District, and approval of the proposed 2018 assessment roll. The proposed 2018 assessment rate of \$0.20/\$100 valuation is estimated to produce \$142,073 at a 75% collection rate. Assessments on real property to fund the PID services.						
State law requires a public hearing by Council to consider the proposed assessments. This action would set the public hearing on the South Congress PID 2018 assessments for August 10, 2017. Approval of the assessment rate and proposed roll on June 15, 2017 allows notices to be sent to property owners, giving them an opportunity to review the property valuations prior to the public hearing. Property owners have a right to challenge their assessment at the hearing. At the hearing, the Council must hear and pass on any objection, made orally or in writing, to any proposed assessment, prior to approval of the ordinance levying assessments, setting the method of collection, and the rate of interest for late payments.
