2300 E. 10TH STREET

PROPOSAL

Demolish a 1939 house.

ARCHITECTURE

One-story, rectangular-plan, side-gabled wood-frame house with asbestos siding, double-hung wood-sash and vinyl-sash windows, and wood trim. Additions include a rear gable-roofed addition on the north and an open carport supported by posts on the west façade.

RESEARCH

2300 E. 10th Street was constructed in 1939. It was occupied from 1940 to 1989 by William J. (Willie) and Frances E. S. Daniels. The Danielses initially rented the house, but had purchased it by 1949. Willie worked as a porter for the Delta Kappa Epsilon Fraternity before enlisting in the Army in 1943. After Willie returned from the war, he worked for more than 23 years as a janitor at the Texas Employment Commission before retiring ca. 1972. Frances is listed in city directories as a maid during World War II. The Danielses were members of the Mt. Olive Baptist Church. They lived in the house until their deaths: Frances in 1988 and Willie in 1989.

STAFF COMMENTS

The house was surveyed as part of the East Austin Historic Resource Survey in 2016. It was recommended not eligible for local or National Register designation.

Designation Criteria—Historic Landmark

- 1) The building is more than 50 years old, having been constructed in 1939.
- 2) The building retains a moderate degree of integrity. It retains a high degree of integrity of location, setting, and craftsmanship. It retains a moderate degree of integrity of design, materials, and feeling. Integrity of association is not applicable.
- 3) The property does not appear to demonstrate significance according to any of the historic designation criteria listed in the City of Austin Land Development Code (Section 25-2-352).
 - a. **Architecture.** The house is built in a vernacular style. It does not appear to be architecturally significant.
 - b. **Historical association.** The property has longstanding associations with the family of Willie and Frances Daniels, as it was been owned and inhabited by the Daniels family from 1940 to 1989. However, there do not appear to be significant historical associations.
 - c. **Archaeology.** The property was not evaluated for its potential to yield significant data concerning the human history or prehistory of the region.
 - d. **Community value.** The property does not possess a unique location, physical characteristic, or significant feature that contributes to the character, image, or cultural identity of the city, East Austin, or a particular group.
 - e. **Landscape feature.** The property is not a significant natural or designed landscape with artistic, aesthetic, cultural, or historical value to the city.

Designation Criteria—Historic Area (HD) Combining District


The 2300 block of E. 10th Street does not meet the criteria for designation as a local historic district. The street includes new construction, houses built across a wide range of time periods, and widespread alterations.

This house does not appear to meet the criteria for designation, either as a historic landmark or as a contributing structure to a potential local historic district.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the Commission encourage rehabilitation and adaptive reuse. If rehabilitation and reuse are not feasible, then staff encourages relocation over demolition, and recommends release of the permit upon completion of a City of Austin Documentation Package consisting of photographs of all elevations, a dimensioned sketch plan, and a narrative history, for archiving at the Austin History Center.

Biographical Notes

William J. Daniels was born in Travis County on August 11, 1907. He attended college for two years, and worked as a porter or janitor for his entire career. He enlisted in the Army in November 1943, when he was 36. He died on February 20, 1989.

Frances Eva Smith Daniels was born on April 5, 1908. She worked as a maid when her husband William was in the army; it is not clear from records whether she continued to work after he returned. She died on September 11, 1988.

Before they moved to 2300 E. 10th Street, the Danielses rented at 1184 Navasota. At the time, William Daniels was working at a porter, with no place of employment listed.

The Danielses were members of Mt. Olive Baptist Church. Mt. Olive was founded in 1889 and originally occupied a building at 1103 E. 4th Street, in the Masontown African

American community. The church moved to a new building at 1113 Leona—half a mile from 2300 E. 10th Street—ca. 1940. Mt. Olive's current church building at 1800 E. 11th Street was constructed in 1956. It stands a five-minute walk (0.3 miles) from 2300 E. 10th Street.

William J. (Willie) Daniels

William J. (Willie) Daniels, age 81, of Austin, died February 20, 1989.

He was born on August 11, 1907, in Travis County.

He was a veteran of World War II and a member of Mt. Olive Baptist Church.

His wife, Frances Daniels, preceded him in death.

Funeral services will be held at 2:00 PM, Friday, February 24, 1989, at Mt. Olive Baptist Church, with Reverend Raphael C. Smith officiating. Burial will be in Capital Memorial Gardens.

Mr. Daniels is survived by his two sisters, Willie M. McGee of Denver, Colorado, Ann M. Daniels of Dallas, Texas; two nieces, Beverly Boyd of Austin, Texas, Mary Dulan of Oklahoma; three great-nephews, Sgt. Jeffrey L. Spencer of Fort Riley, Kansas, Kevin Spencer of Austin, Texas, Malik Dulan of Oklahoma; and one great-niece, Ameerah Dulan of Oklahoma.
