

Downtown Commission Annual Internal Review

This report covers the time period of 7/1/2016 to 6/30/2017

The Commission's mission statement (per the City Code) is to:

- (1) advise the City Council and city staff regarding policies and projects impacting downtown Austin;
- (2) serve as stewards for the Downtown Austin Plan and, as such:
 - (a) serve as a sounding board for the city council and staff on the implementation of the Downtown Austin Plan and CodeNEXT; and
 - (b) offer recommendations on amendments to the Downtown Austin Plan and CodeNEXT as needed;
- (3) maintain liaison relationships with City staff and other boards and commissions; and
- (4) perform other activities as directed by City Council.

The Commission began meeting as a full commission in May of 2016 and continues to fill member positions. The Commission has received briefings on the District Cooling Plant No. 3, Convention Center Expansion, Lamar Beach at Town Lake Metro Park Draft Masterplan, Austin Strategic Housing Plan, Capital Metro "Connections" 2025, Waller Creek Restoration and Rehabilitation, Public Restrooms in Downtown and the Downtown Austin Plan in connection with CodeNEXT.
