► The City of Austin expects to receive approximately \$11.6 million in federal formula grant funding from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development for Fiscal Year 2017-18

- Street Outreach
- Emergency Shelter
- Homelessness Prevention
- Rapid Rehousing: relocation and stabilization services
- Data Collection
- Admin (≤ 7.5%)

- Acquisition, rehabilitation or new construction of housing units
- Facility operating costs
- Rental assistance
- Short-term
 payments to prevent
 homelessness
- Supportive Services
- Admin (≤ 3%)


What NHCD Staff Heard	Actions to Address
Focus on existing home repair programs that keep people in their homes and allow people to age in place. Evaluate whether mobile homes are eligible for existing home repair programs that use federal and local funding	Continue allocating local and federal funding for existing home repair programs. NHCD staff is currently conducting a feasibility study regarding mobile home repair
More funding for renter assistance: utilities, rent payments, more construction of affordable rental units	Continue to leverage resources to maximize outcomes
More affordable housing near transit	City Council adopted Strategic Housing Blueprint which sets goals for affordable housing near transit
Develop an affordable housing resource page	City of Austin recently launched an affordable housing resource page: http://austintexas.gov/affordability
Collect and make available data that tracks subpopulation beneficiary demographics to ensure protected classes' needs are being addressed	The measures NHCD staff track and make available: Median Family Income, Race, Ethnicity, Elderly (age 62.5+) and Female Head of Household as federally required
Address and evaluate local policies and regulations that affect affordable housing	CodeNEXT and Austin Strategic Housing Blueprint make policy and regulatory recommendations to address affordability needs



Federal Allocations




Federal formula grant allocations to the City of Austin between 2014 and 2017 with variance change between FY16-17 and FY 17-18
